Origin

Cultivar.

Non-cultivated form a native of Australia (coastal NSW and QLD) and south-east Asia.

Characteristics

Glossy, bi-pinnate green foliage, turning yellow in autumn. Dark brown fissured bark becoming grey-brown and furrowed with age. Purplish flowers, yellow berry. Elite variety reportedly sterile.

Tolerances

Good urban tolerances, such as compacted sites. Moderate tolerance of drought and waterlogged conditions.

Facts and Trivia

Flowers smell of chocolate.

Berries are toxic, although 'Elite' is purportedly a non-fruiting variety.

The word azedarach is derived from the Persian âzâd-deraxt, meaning free or noble tree.
