in Point Cook in 2021



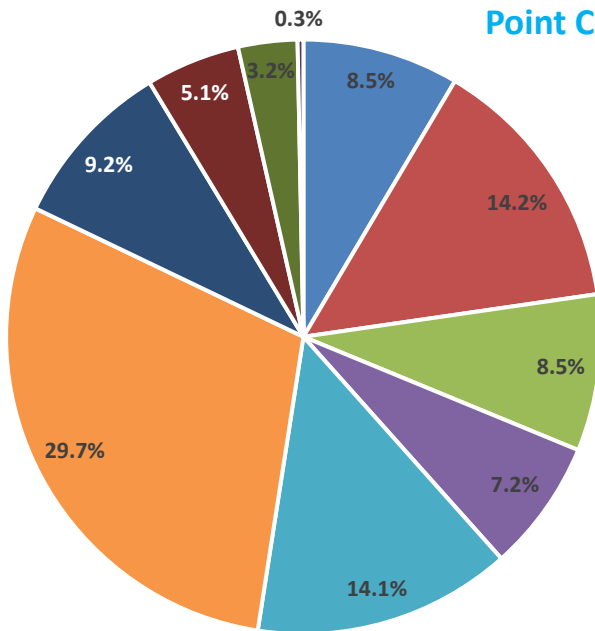
