Rate Capping - What does it mean for you?

In 2015, the State Government introduced legislation that will cap rates in line with the Consumer Price Index. Councils can apply for a variation to the rate cap if they can demonstrate a need.

The impact for Wyndham City is significant as the Strategic Resource Plan is based on a projected rate increase of 5.5% for the next four years. The impact is estimated to be \$5 million in Year 1 and this is likely to compound to \$57 million within four years.

Given the growth pressures that face Wyndham, the challenge cannot be underestimated. Council is now working through how cost savings can be made while balancing services and projects that are important to the community.

Community views are critical to making any future decisions and whether Council decides to apply for a rate cap variation. That's why Council undertook Community Panel Workshops during November and December last year. Residents were invited to participate via an Expression of Interest process. Panels were then established for each ward where 90 Panel Members participated in a series of three intensive workshops.

While each of the Panels made independent recommendations to Council, there were some key themes that emerged across each of the Ward Panels.

- Council to look for efficiencies and alternate sources of revenue
- · Any increase to fees or charges needs to consider equity and affordability for users
- Council must continue to advocate strongly for a fairer deal from State and Federal Governments
- · Council should not make ill-informed cuts to services
- Community views are critical to making any future decisions and the Panels supported further community engagement activities.

At the time this publication was going to print, Wyndham Council was expected to be making a decision as to whether or not it would apply for a rate cap variation in mid - late March 2016. For further updates, visit:

EAGLE SOARS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Wyndham City is excited to announce the completion of Eagle Stadium. With the final stage due to open to the public on Tuesday 14 June, 2016 Eagle Stadium will be the largest indoor recreation facility in Melbourne's West.

The redevelopment was undertaken in two stages. Stage 1, completed in May 2015, delivered 8 new indoor multi sports courts and 4 outdoor netball courts as well as improved car parking, a café area and crèche facilities.

The final stage is set to be fantastic for the community and sports groups who use Eagle Stadium with features including:

- The redevelopment of the basketball stadium with 4 multi-sport indoor courts
- Fully equipped gym with state of the art
- Additional seating in the showcourt with total capacity 1,500 seats
- 460 additional car parks
- · Environmentally sustainable design and construction.

The \$47 million redevelopment project was funded by Wyndham City together with \$650,000 from State Government and \$9 million from the Federal Government. This funding was secured with strong support through the community campaign 'Fix the Rec' launched in February 2013.

Works will start on the new playground at Point Cook's Bayview Park in coming months after Wyndham residents gave the design their seal of approval.

Wyndham City received feedback from over 300 people through an online survey and two display days' held at Bayview Park. The response was positive with both residents and visitors pleased with the updated design.

The approved design is very similar to the original pirate ship playground, which was destroyed by arson in late 2014. Some adjustments have been made to ensure community safety at the site including the use of wood look-alike product and increased visibility.

Wyndham City is currently looking into establishing a 'Friends of Bayview Park' group to assist with looking after the playground, a suggestion strongly supported by the community.

Construction is expected to be complete later in the year.



Station Place Lights Up

Wyndham City has joined forces with the Department of Justice and Regulation to deliver a lighting upgrade and artwork installation at Werribee's Station Place.

Officially launched in February by Member for Werribee, The Hon. Tim Pallas MP and Wyndham City's Mayor Cr Adele Hegedich, the project is responsible for the upgrade of lighting in Station Place and both adjoining laneways (West – Barnes Place and East – Comben Drive). The new lighting features low energy consumption LEDs and is in line with Council's commitment to reducing our carbon footprint. The lights were designed to increase public safety by improving visibility and attracting greater use of the spaces. Further to this, the laneway lights change colour and can be sequenced for events.

In addition to the improved lighting, the project included the installation of street art along each of the laneways. The transformation of the laneways into public art galleries grew out of Council's annual RED program. The laneway artwork was developed by local artists with Blender Studios and includes representation of patterns of cultural significance to Wyndham's diverse communities. The laneways will feature an annual rolling program of artwork with artists returning to rework the various pieces.
