

Wyndham residents are being offered another chance to get involved with the Get Wyndham Moving campaign.

Residents can head to the Get Wyndham Moving website and submit a letter, urging the State Government to upgrade Dohertys Road east of Fitzgerald Road and widen Sayers Road between the RAAF Base and Derrimut Road.

The letters simply require residents to input their name, address and personal stories. Residents will be adding their voice to the hundreds who have already submitted letters, requesting urgent upgrades.

Wyndham City recently announced it was doing it's part with the \$6.7 million widening of Dohertys Road between Foundation Road and Fitzgerald Road in Laverton North; street lighting upgrades and landscaping works currently underway.


