REDEVELOPMENT OF CHIRNSIDE PARK

Late last year, Wyndham City received a double dose of good news with the Federal Government's announcement of \$3.25 million for the redevelopment of Chirnside Park and the State Government committing \$1.5 million - meaning it's game on for the project.

The project will create a community and sports hub for local residents to connect and participate in activities ranging from AFL football, cricket, community education and programs like the North Melbourne Football Club "Huddle". The 'Huddle' is an award winning program that brings together young people from migrant and refugee backgrounds.

Features include:

- Sporting pavilion
- Sports based training spaces
- A grandstand
- Commercial kitchen and cafe
- Multi-purpose social, meeting and community spaces
- Media rooms
- Coaches spaces
- Landscaping and car parking

Wyndham City is contributing up to \$5.5 million for the project, which is the result of a collaborative effort between Council, the Werribee Football Club, AFL, VFL, State and Federal Governments and the North Melbourne Huddle.

Works on the project are expected to start in mid-2016.

My Story



Khurram and his family

Khurram Jahangir Kahn

Wyndham City has launched its online multicultural storybook, inviting people who have come to live in our municipality from across the country and across the world to share their stories.

It's a great way to celebrate our rich cultural diversity and we want to collect stories from Manila to Manchester, Maningrida to Moscow – stories like Khurram's.

Khurram and his family arrived in Wyndham around 3 years ago from Pakistan and he has gone on to be one of the community's highest achievers, recently winning a Victorian Multicultural Award and the Mayoral Youth Award.

Here are just a few highlights from his story:

My grandparents moved to Australia 30 years ago, originally settling in Sydney when my mother was very young. My mother completed her high school in Australia, but returned to Pakistan. My grandparents then moved to Wyndham and when we would come to visit, we loved the safe and lively environment in Hoppers Crossing. So, a couple of years ago, when it was time for me to start my University studies, we moved to Hoppers Crossing – Australia offers great education opportunities. I am currently completing my studies in Biomedicine at Melbourne University.

Wyndham neighbourhoods are diverse, with people from many different nationalities and cultures. There's great range of restaurants on Watton Street and the ever-expanding Pacific Werribee. One of the first things I did on moving to Wyndham was start volunteering with the Sudanese Australian Integrated Learning System (SAILS), tutoring high school students in science

subjects. I encourage people who are new to Wyndham to start volunteering or join a local club as it is a great way to further adapt and understand the beautiful society we live in.

You don't have to be an award winner like Khurram to submit your stories – we're keen to hear from everyone from Market Gardeners and teachers, teenagers to the elderly.

a day in the life . . .



From professional comedy, music and drama to local school productions and dance performances, the Wyndham Cultural Centre has a wide range of shows on throughout the year.

The Centre has State of the Art Theatre facilities, including a 477 seat theatre, professional lighting sound and AV systems, bar and box office. It is an amazing asset for Wyndham, from an artistic, economic and tourism perspective.

Here's what a typical day in the life of Michele Domonos, Wyndham Cultural Centre Venue Manager, looks like:

- 8am** - Go over daily tasks with centre staff to review the previous days activities and performances. Inspect theatre to go over any maintenance requirements such as new seats for the theatre and upgrades to lighting equipment.
- 9am** - Meet with local dance group who are looking to hire the centre for their concert, provide them with a tour of facilities and find out their technical and access requirements.
- 10am** - Take part in a teleconference with other Victorian theatre Venue Managers regarding the safety requirements and marketing requirements of a show that is touring in the near future.
- 1pm** - Meet with marketing team to discuss promotion of upcoming shows to residents and visitors to come along and see one or many of the great shows at our theatre.
- 2pm** - Discuss new developments in LED lighting technology for theatre with a lighting provider in the Tattersall's Theatre, and go over current options available.
- 3pm** - Review upcoming theatre season with our technical, front of house and box office staff to determine staffing, seating and ticketing requirements.
- 4pm** - Respond to a producer who is seeking to lock in upcoming performances at the Theatre. Arrange to attend performances in the evening to assess the success of the show.

youth clinic @ Youth Resource Centre

Wyndham's young people have a place to go for free, confidential help on a range of Health Matters - the Youth Clinic.

The service, which is available for Wyndham residents aged 12-25 years, runs every Wednesday from 2pm – 6pm at the Youth Resource Centre, Hoppers Crossing.

Young people can drop in or pre-book an appointment with the female doctor or nurse about health matters, including:

- Contraception: free condoms, advice about all methods including implant fitting
- STI (sexually transmitted infections) testing and treatment
- General health checks
- Mental health including referral to counselling services

HAVE YOUR SAY ON WERRIBEE'S GATEWAY

Wyndham City is planning for one of Wyndham's best known gateways and we need your help.

An Urban Design Framework has been prepared that will provide a long term vision for how the Princes Highway - Geelong Road Corridor, a major gateway entrance into Werribee and suburbs beyond, can be brought to life.

The aim is to improve the overall appearance of the corridor, commencing from the Werribee turn-off and it continues into the Werribee City Centre, running down Synnot Street, crossing the Werribee River and continuing south-west down the Geelong Road and connecting back to the Princes Freeway.

Following initial consultation, the draft Urban Design Framework is now out for public comment.

Some of the fantastic features of the framework are:

- Gateway features and landscaping
- Improved amenity and access for pedestrians and cyclists
- Creating safe environments
- Enhance the City's image and appearance

Feedback is sought from residents, businesses and community groups on whether the vision and objectives are right for this key corridor. The plan is open for comment until Friday, 12 February 2016.

You can dispose of the following by visiting the Transfer Station located at the Refuse Disposal Facility at 470 Wests Road, Werribee.



Car batteries



Motor oil



Fluorescent tubes and compact fluorescent lights



Expanded polystyrene/foam



Paint (small quantities)



Glass bottles, jars and steel or aluminium cans



Hard plastics – types coded 1-7



E-Waste: Computers, computer accessories, printers, scanners, cables and televisions.

Only these items are FREE OF CHARGE. Disposing these items along with general, hard, and/or green waste may incur disposal fees.

HERE ARE SOME OF THE EASIEST WAYS TO GET RID OF YOUR UNWANTED ITEMS:

Hard and green Waste Collection:

Wyndham City offers all residents two Hard and Green Waste Collections each financial year. Up to 3 cubic metres of hard and green waste is allowed per collection.

Use your Waste Management Tokens:

Ratepayers receive two Waste Management Tokens with their August rates notice each year to recycle items or dispose of waste at no charge. If you are renting ask your Landlord or Real Estate Agent.

Participate in the Garage Sale Trail:

Each year in October, Wyndham City takes part in the national Garage Sale Trail. This is a perfect opportunity to sell unwanted items. Last year, each garage sale had, on average, 39 customers and made \$391.

Go to a Detox your Home collection point:

Reduce the risk of poisoning, environmental pollution and bushfire hazards by dropping off unwanted, highly toxic chemicals at the Victorian Government's FREE chemical collection program.

Take reusable unwanted items to a charity store:

Take reusable items that are in good condition to charity stores and support those in need. Remember if it is not in a good resale condition, then you need to dispose of it by other means.

JOINING FORCES

The Get Wyndham Moving campaign is joining forces with other growth area Councils to secure federal budget funding.

In 2016 Wyndham City will partner with the National Growth Areas Alliance (NGAA) in the Fund Our Future campaign. The NGAA represents 23 growth Councils across Australia and aims to give people living in fast growing outer suburb areas the same opportunities as those living in our Capital Cities.

The new Fund Our Future campaign is aimed at achieving a commitment from the Federal Government to create a dedicated outer growth suburbs infrastructure fund, advocating for priority road, public transport and health projects for the fast growing outer suburbs.

Wyndham's part in the campaign includes campaigning for a \$200 million "Roads to Jobs" funding package for upgrades to Dohertys, Palmers and Leakes Roads and turning the Duncans Road exit into a full diamond interchange to assist Wyndham's local economy.

The campaign will be launched in February and residents will be able to view the website and see how you can get involved.



WYNDHAM INTEGRATED TRANSPORT STRATEGY

Wyndham City is currently developing a strategy in response to one of residents and businesses major concerns – traffic congestion.

The Wyndham Integrated Transport Strategy is a long-term plan which outlines the advocacy required and how Wyndham's transport system should be developed to 2040 and beyond.

Wyndham residents will shortly have an opportunity to provide feedback on the revised draft Transport Policy, as well as the draft Wyndham Integrated Transport Strategy.

Celebrating a Healthier Wyndham

Healthy Together Wyndham has a lot to celebrate - the initiative was launched in 2012 and some of the many achievements include:

- 9 community kitchens operating in Wyndham
- 10 Wyndham sports clubs and leisure centres now offering healthy food
- 8 Wyndham schools now successfully encourage regular walking and riding to school
- 1500 children from 3 active travel pilot schools walk or ride to school regularly
- 548 locals learned healthy cooking skills at Jamie's Ministry of Food Mobile Kitchen
- Silver Chef Laverton North became first Victorian business to complete Healthy Workplaces Achievement Program
- Healthy barbecues toolkit developed
- Healthy catering guide published with eight local caterers offering healthy options
- No sugary drinks served at the 2015 Children's Week Picnic
- Veggie, herb and fruit growing workshops.

Healthy Together Wyndham have provided information and support about living healthier lives to 65 per cent of Wyndham schools, over 40 local workplaces and 63 per cent of Wyndham Kindergartens and child care centres.

Although funding for the initiative has been significantly reduced, the work to improve health locally will continue, with Council funding and a Victorian Government grant.

This year, Healthy Together Wyndham will support another four Wyndham schools to get children and families walking and riding to school, as well as supporting local workplaces, sporting clubs, leisure centres, schools, kindergartens and childcare services to be healthier.

Council will investigate ways we can improve community access to fresh, affordable, locally grown produce and determine what we can do to minimise the negative impacts of alcohol.
