# GET WYNDHAM MOVING

The new railway stations at Wyndham Vale and Wyndham City is aware of missing sections of footpath leading to the new Tarneit Station, adjacent to vacant land along parts of Tarneit will be operational when the Regional Rail Leakes Road and Derrimut Road. Link (RRL) officially opens on Sunday 21 June.

The RRL will increase the size of Victoria's rail network, with 90km of new track and dedicated regional lines from West Werribee Junction to Deer Park, then along the existing rail corridor from Sunshine to Southern Cross Train Station.

To coincide with this change, Wyndham's bus network will be restructured to provide a well-integrated multi-modal network in which train and bus services are coordinated and run more frequently to both the new Geelong line and the Werribee line.



# ROAD UPGRADES OR WYNDHAM

Wyndham residents will soon benefit from two road projects at Palmers Road in Point Cook and the Princes Freeway off ramp at Forsyth Road in Hoppers Crossing that will reduce travel time, making it easier to access public transport and improve safety.

Palmers Road will receive a bus transit lane and traffic lights at the corner of Palmers and Dunnings Roads will be adjusted to allow buses more time to pass through the intersection. Access to the Williams Landing Railway Station will also be improved. The State Government has contributed \$3.75 million and Wyndham City \$3 million towards this project.

The upgrade to Palmers Road was a key focus for the 'Get Wyndham Moving' campaign and Councillors and our local resident Transport Champions worked incredibly hard to raise the profile of this much needed project, so it is great to see it included in the Budget.

The Princes Freeway off ramp at Forsyth Road will be widened to two lanes and will reduce the length of traffic queues, particularly during the evening peak period and will reduce the risk of rear-end collisions.

To improve accessibility for residents wishing to walk to the new Tarneit Station, Wyndham City is working to have concrete or temporary gravel footpaths installed in these missing sections prior to the opening.

Temporary footpaths are being installed in some locations because the land is expected to be developed in the near future and the temporary footpaths will be replaced or proposed roadworks will require the footpath location to be shifted.

# THE EAGLE HAS LANDED

As part of the transformation to the largest indoor sporting facility in Melbourne's west, Stage 1 of Eagle Stadium was completed on the 27 May. The \$47 million redevelopment project is funded by Wyndham City together with \$650,000 from State Government and \$9 million from the Federal Government funding secured with strong support by a community campaign launched in February 2013.

- Crèche facilities

Stage 2 works have commenced and the full redevelopment will be complete in 2016.

# 2015/16 **DRAFT BUDGET** REVEALED

New roads, parks, kinders, a community centre and a new library are just some of the key infrastructure projects included in the draft 2015/16 budget.



Wyndham City released its draft budget 2015/2016, which includes \$91.26m in new capital works projects, at the Rates Showcase in April. The event gave residents the opportunity to get firsthand information on how their rates are being spent - from events and new roads to kindergartens and recycling. The proposed budget includes an average 5.5 per cent rate increase, allowing service levels to be maintained, implementation of a number of new initiatives and to also accomodate a reduction in Government Grants.

Specific works in the draft 2015/16 budget include:

- \$5.1 million on Leakes Road from Tarneit to Davis Road
- \$4.2 million on Dohertys Road reconstruction from Fitzgerald and Foundation Road
- \$4.07 million on Saltwater Promenade **Community Centre**



- \$2.6 million on Clearwood Drive Pavilion and Car Park
- \$1.2 million on Truganina South Kindergarten
- \$1.8 million on a pedestrian bridge over **Skeleton Creek**
- \$3.6 million on Galvin Park Master Plan Implementation
- \$2.13 million on Mainview Boulevard Reserve



This includes \$27 million on buildings projects, \$20.37 million on roads. \$8.7 million on recreation and leisure projects and **\$4.17** million on parks and open space.

The draft budget also features a number of new initiatives, including:

- · Working with the residents to implement the Wyndham 2040 Community Plan
- Develop a Reconciliation Action Plan building respect between Aboriginals and **Torres Strait Islanders**
- Opening of the new Tarneit Library
- Develop and implement Council's Customer Service Strategy.

Council will adopt the final budget at a special council meeting on Monday 15 June.

## Local kids take the active way to school

Hundreds more local kids are now regularly walking, riding, scooting or skating to school, thanks to grants and support from Wyndham City's 'Healthy Together Wyndham'.

And the numbers are set to boom, with Healthy Together Wyndham providing five more local schools with grants of \$5,000 to create active travel to school plans that support staff, students and families getting to school on foot, bike or scooter.

Since 2014, Alamanda College in Point Cook, Baden Powell College in Tarneit and Corpus Christi Primary School in Werribee have launched active travel to school plans, with the support of Healthy Together Wyndham and Bicycle Victoria. All have reported a significant increase in the number of children, families and staff taking the active way to school.

Work is now underway at Iramoo. Bellbridge and St James the Apostle primary schools, Manor Lakes College and The Grange, to establish school travel plans.



# Don't let your home become a housefire statistic!

In 2014, the 3 most common causes of fire in Wyndham homes were Cooking, Electrical and Heating, with a majority of these fires occurring in kitchens and bedrooms.

## East Werribee road works now underway

VicRoads advises Wyndham residents to be aware of changed traffic conditions as road works for the East Werribee Employment Precinct start to ramp up over the next few months.

#### **ABOUT THE PROJECT**

The \$71 million road project, which VicRoads is delivering on behalf of the Metropolitan Planning Authority, will cater for the East Werribee Employment Precinct, located between Point Cook and Werribee.

Construction has started for the first stage of the project, which involves building a new freeway interchange at Sneydes Road.

Works have also begun at two intersections on Princes Highway, at the corner of Sneydes Road and at the Hoppers Lane and Old Geelong Road intersection and are planned to be completed before the new interchange opens in 2016.

The final stage of the project includes widening Sneydes Road will commence in mid 2015.

#### ROAD WORKS IN COMING MONTHS

Drivers are advised to look out for changed traffic conditions such as temporary lane closures on Sneydes Road and lower speed limits near the roadworks on Princes Highway.

Bradley Smits, Director of Operations at VicRoads has advised that these road works will be happening simultaneously, so drivers are encouraged to plan ahead and allow additional time.

"While there may be some inconvenience to drivers in the shortterm, we need to ensure that works are safely completed, while traffic keeps moving."
