


## Creating your PressReader Account

While you can use PressReader without an account, registering allows you to bookmark your favourite articles and save them for later. You can also set up email alerts for subjects you're interested in, share or comment on articles, or archive articles for later use.

You can use the same account on up to five devices, and it will keep your spot for you in all your articles.

## The PressReader App

PressReader also has an app for each of the major platforms, which makes it easier to download articles to read later. Download the app from your preferred store, and connect to the library's hotspot to access PressReader.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What is a PressReader hotspot?

This is a wireless public network within an organisation that has subscribed to PressReader and is offering access to its users. Each of our five Wyndham City Libraries branches is a PressReader hotspot. Accessing PressReader via a hotspot allows you to read publications for free and "renew" access from home (i.e. get an extra 7 days to access content away from the library).

### Why isn't a specific title available (eg. The Herald Sun)?

Not all newspapers and magazines are available through PressReader at this time. More titles are being added constantly.

### Need more help with PressReader or other eLibrary resources?

Do you feel you need more help with PressReader, or are you interested in finding out how to read other eMagazines and eBooks on your tablet?

## What is PressReader?

PressReader is a subscription service provided by Wyndham City Libraries that gives you access to 5000+ newspapers and magazines from around the world on your PC/tablet/phone. Newspapers and magazines are available in over 60 languages from 100 countries. PressReader can be accessed via an app (available on all the major platforms) or an internet browser.

## Reading newspapers or magazines at the Library

Visit [www.pressreader.com](http://www.pressreader.com) while logged on to one of our Public Access computers, or on your own device using our wireless connection.

You can search for a specific publication, browse all publications by country or genre, or read the Home Feed to see top stories within Australia.



Use Page View to see the article laid out exactly like the original publication.



Click the heading of the article to return to Text View.



## Reading newspapers or magazines at home

Before using PressReader at home, visit any branch of the library and connect to our wireless network.

When connected to our network, download your favourite publications to your own device, and keep reading them at home.

As long as you have visited the library and logged in to PressReader (either on the website or via an app) through our Library hotspot, you will be able to keep reading content outside the library for up to seven days. After seven days are up, you simply need to return to a branch of Wyndham City Libraries to re-authenticate your account.
