Building Blocker Profile: Abul, Jasmine, Mallika, Reeta (You Are Not Alone project) **Project:** 'You are not alone' — A program that encourages women from diverse backgrounds to come together to celebrate being women and provide support and strength to tackle issues around social connectedness, relationships and family violence. We had a chat with Reeta Verma, one of the project members, to find out some more about the project.

What kind of activities did you undertake with the people who participated in your project? 'We divided the group's activities into four broad themes: Women and Business, Women and the Law, Women and Music, and Celebrate Being a Woman. Together, they learnt to make candles and soaps. They heard from the professional lawyers about their work rights and how to seek help in family violence and also how to engage the community in the prevention of family violence. They learnt from Business Women how to run a successful business and how to make business plans. They danced on the tunes of Bollywood, Chinese, Samoan and Chin music. They shared multicultural food, exchanged recipes, learnt to do yoga and meditation.'

What was the most successful aspect of your project? 'Women from all walks of life joined in the events and activities and enjoyed being in the company of each other. Despite age, ethic, language and cultural differences, they enjoyed the project's activities.'

Did you come across any issues whilst completing your project? 'Though we successfully managed to get approximately 40-50 enthusiastic women in our sessions and engaged them fully in the group activities, our biggest barrier was how to bring women to the venue. Young mothers from the Somalian and South-Sudanese backgrounds could not be fully engaged due to their family commitments and perhaps language difficulties.'

What new skills did you learn whilst completing your project? Working with people from diverse backgrounds, different personality types and varied work ethics can be very challenging. We learnt that being patient, remaining positive despite differences and open ourselves to critique and suggestions is the key to develop and deliver a successful project/program. The Building Blocks training taught us the communication skills and listening skills, project management, grant writing skills, and skills working with group dynamics - these skills were put into practice when we delivered the project.'

Facts:

9 Building Blocks courses have been completed so far, developing 58 projects with more in the pipeline. So far, 136 students across 46 different cultural groups have graduated from the Building Blocks Program, with 46 more to graduate in February 2016 = 182 BB's
