



## GET WYNDHAM MOVING HOW WYNDHAM CITY FOUGHT FOR YOU

In 2014, Council launched Get Wyndham Moving. This landmark campaign put Wyndham's roads on the agenda for the State and Federal Governments, making it clear that residents wanted to see action and that projects reducing traffic congestion needed to be delivered.

The Campaign targeted the 2014 State Election and the 2015/16 Victorian Budget, using these opportunities to secure funding for vital road projects.

With the community well and truly behind us, the campaign created a major buzz. Billboards were erected throughout Wyndham, a petition was signed by over 5,500 people and it was featured on the front page of major newspapers and in nightly news bulletins. In one year alone we attended over 65 events to spread the Get Wyndham Moving message.

After lots of hard work and plenty of input from residents, the Get Wyndham Moving Campaign led to the State Government pledging to spend:

- \$1.2 billion on new and existing roads in Wyndham
- \$52 million on upgrading Dohertys Rd
- \$45 million on the Sneydes Rd interchange, which has made it easier for people travelling from Point Cook, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing to get on and off the Princes Freeway
- \$3.75 million on the upgrade of Palmers Rd in Point Cook.



## **INVESTMENT AND ADVOCACY FIXING** WYNDHAM'S ROADS



After years of work by Wyndham City and the community, vital new roads are set to be built in Wyndham while existing roads will receive major upgrades.

Over the last 10 years Council has spent about \$200 million on fixing and upgrading Wyndham's roads.

On average we invest \$7 million on maintenance like fixing potholes, \$3 million on resurfacing works, and up to \$20 million on upgrading and rebuilding roads so that they are safer and easier to drive on.

For almost 20 years Council has been working hard to ensure that Wyndham gets its fair share of funding. As our population has continued to grow at an astonishing rate, Council has campaigned strongly for improvements to local infrastructure.

Through our Get Wyndham Moving campaign, which you can read about on the opposite page, we successfully advocated to the State Government to spend more money on Wyndham's roads.

# WYNDLIAM'S ROADS SET FOR

The State Government has pledged to spend \$1.2 billion on upgrading Wyndham's roads, while Wyndham City will spend \$70 million over the next three years.

#### MAJOR STATE GOVERNMENT ROAD PROJECTS


**Dunnings and Palmers Roads** from Point Cook Rd to the Princes Freeway will be widened, providing extra lanes to and from the freeway and reducing the travel time for residents who drive to the city for work.

**Extra lanes on Palmers Rd** from the Princes Freeway to the Western Freeway in Truganina will provide trucks and other vehicles with another way of getting onto the Western Ring Road while avoiding the Princes Freeway/ Western Ring Road Interchange.

### The construction of the Duncans Rd Interchange

in Werribee South will make it easier for visitors heading to the Werribee Park Tourism Precinct. This project will also make it easier to get to and from Geelong and reduce the traffic on Synnot St.

**Three level crossings are being removed** – the Werribee St and Cherry St crossings in Werribee and the Aviation Rd crossing in Laverton. This will mean that people will spend less time in their cars as they will not get stuck waiting at the boom gates.
