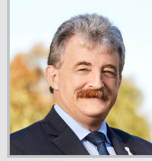

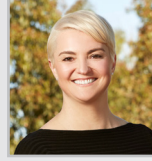

KINDER**



Did you know our children are at risk of missing out on five hours of kinder a week?

Today, all four-year-old children in Victoria receive universal access to 15 hours of kindergarten a week.

The State Government funds 10 hours, while the Federal Government foots the bill for the remaining 5 hours.

This deal is set to expire in December 2018.

Wyndham City's Learning City Portfolio Holder, Cr Josh Gilligan said if the Federal Government doesn't renew the agreement, Wyndham will be among the hardest hit.

"In Wyndham, one in four residents are aged under 4 - the highest proportion of kids in any Australian municipality."

"This means kinder cuts will really hurt our community," Cr Gilligan said.

Family Friendly City Portfolio Holder, Cr Mia Shaw, said countless studies have proven that early childhood education has a positive benefit on the development of children.

"If the Federal Government doesn't continue to fund their fair share of kinder, families will face an extra \$2,000 in childcare costs or our kids will just miss out on valuable early education."

Wyndham City has launched a new campaign - dubbed I Love Kinder - to raise awareness of the campaign.

Keep an eye out for our ambassadors promoting the campaign at events around Wyndham.

## Facelift for Wyndham Park

A revamped Wyndham Park will offer a friendly and welcoming space to host events, activities or just to hang out.

Concept designs have been prepared for the redeveloped Wyndham Park along the Werribee River in consultation with the community, in a bid to create a landmark regional park for recreation and events with attractions for people of all ages.

The design includes a number of play spaces, activity areas and other attractions, while celebrating the environmental qualities of the park and connection to the Werribee City Centre is strengthened.

Other features of the fresh, new park include seating, shelters, barbecues, toilets, drinking fountains, and a fenced off-lead park for dogs.

Pathways weave throughout the park to provide access to all areas and connect to the Werribee River Trail and City Centre.

Community consultation has been open since early November, and will continue until 8th of December, 2017.

Construction is expected to kick off in 2018.

This Tarneit park has received a breath of fresh air, with an expanded playground area, new basketball court, recreational seating areas, and lots of new trees for shade.

### LANDSCAPE DRIVE PARK

A brand new full sized multi sports court is just one of the features at this Truganina park. There is also new playground equipment, shade shelter and seating, tree cover for shade, and a large lawn area.

### JAMES COOK DRIVE PARK

Central lawn areas for ball sports, a new basketball court, and a bigger and better playground are among the new features at this park in Truganina.

### ALISON STREET PARK

More plants, trees, furniture and play equipment make up the new-look park. For those who love to skate, a skate park is another feature at Alison Street in Truganina.

## Cr Henry Barlow Growth and Transport

This portfolio takes on the difficult task of managing growth in our rapidly growing City. It focuses on ways to manage this, and looks at the municipality as a whole to investigate how planning can be applied to accommodate growth.

Cr Barlow said the latest census data showed just how important it was to manage growth and transport in Wyndham.

"It's no secret that Wyndham is one of the fastest growing municipalities in Australia. According to the 2016 Census, this trend has continued with more than 55,000 people moving here since 2011. This is a growth of 34.4 per cent."

“ This rapid growth has had a major impact on our roads and public transport networks. Council's latest Traffic Management Report found that 22 sections of road throughout Wyndham are at or above capacity, with VicRoads responsible for 18 of the 22. ”

"As part of our campaigning for better infrastructure, the State Government has committed to spend \$1.8 billion to build new roads and upgrade existing ones over the next four years, starting in 2018."

"We've been working tirelessly through this portfolio, including developing cycling and pedestrian strategies, to come up with practical ways we can get vehicles off our roads and reduce congestion for people travelling to and from work."

Cr Barlow served as Growth and Transport Portfolio Holder until November 2017. It is a special Mayoral portfolio that changes hands annually.

## Cr Intaj Khan Urban Futures

This portfolio has a goal of making Wyndham more liveable as our population continues to soar. Urban design, financial planning, along with meeting the needs of our growing community are among the focuses of Urban Futures. It also assists in advocating to state and federal government for critical public transport, roads, and other infrastructure.

Cr Intaj Khan said it was important to work towards making Wyndham a more liveable municipality into the future.

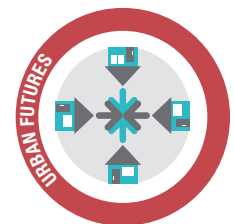
"With Wyndham growing so fast, we have major challenges ahead of us to improve the liveability of our municipality for all residents."

“ One example of the work we've been doing in this area is the implementation of the Development Contribution Plan – Project Implementation Program, or DCP PIPs. ”

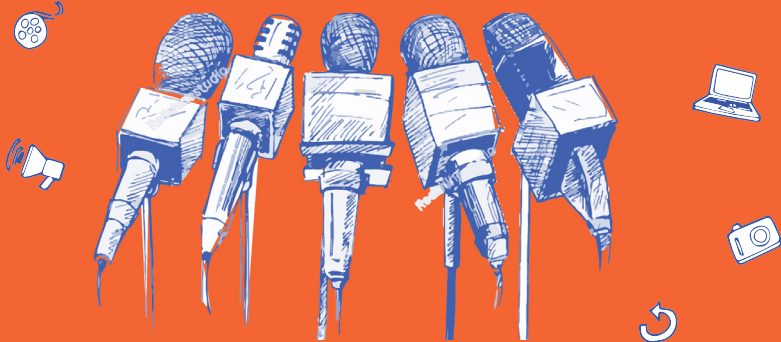
"The plans map out the order in which Council-owned and run infrastructure and facilities that are funded through Development Contributions are rolled out, to best match with the development of new housing estates."

Thanks to a \$440,000 grant from the Victorian Government, creative young people aged 16 to 25 years will have the opportunity to join the Crew.

They will be trained and gain skills in leadership, creative arts, media and project management.

Accredited training in Digital Media will be provided to fifty eligible young people.

The eYouth Crew will meet weekly for up to 12 months in order to develop a creative arts-based project.

Women in Wyndham have been kickstarting healthy new lifestyles thanks to a new program delivered by Wyndham City in partnership with the Western Bulldogs.

### WYNDHAM'S WORK WINS

A joint project between Wyndham City and Melton City has been recognised as one of the best emergency projects in the state.

The two western suburbs Councils have jointly won the 2017 Resilient Australia Award for the project which has sought to establish a coordinated effort for the two Cities to withstand and recover from emergency disasters.

The project educated community leaders about disaster resilience through a forum held in late 2015. The two Councils then collected evidence from the forum and used it for a title which has been published in a national journal, and gained attention from government departments and universities.

The project is in the running for an award from the Federal Government later this year.

# WIDENING, UPGRADING, BUILDING AND EXTENDING

We've been busy upgrading roads, community facilities and sporting reserves around Wyndham. With our record \$133 million spend on capital works in this year's annual budget, there's plenty going on around the City.

## Roads, bridges, carparks

### Skeleton Creek Bridge

The bridge over Skeleton Creek is complete, with the railing now installed along the decking. Works are also complete on the new toilet block.

### Tarneit Road widening

The morning commute is about to get a whole lot easier, with gutters being laid on the side of the road. This project, which will see the number of lanes between Hogans Road and Caraleena Drive doubling from two to four, will be complete by March next year.

### West End Car Park

Scheduled for completion just in time for Christmas, an additional 180 parking spaces will open at the West End Car Park at the Werribee City Centre. The new car park will be located at the former Werribee Toyota site and the land at the rear of the Bridge Hotel.

## Kicking goals for the community

### Williams Landing Reserve

We're currently evaluating tenders, deciding who will build this exciting and much-needed pavilion in Harrison Ward.

### Soldiers Reserve

The tender has been awarded, and works have commenced on the alterations to Soldiers Reserve Pavilion, bringing the facility up to community standards. Expected to be complete by April 2018.

### Chirside Park Oval

One of the most exciting upgrades in our City. The project is nearing completion, with the new pavilion almost there. The final product will feature a state of the art pavilion, sports based training spaces, community spaces and more. This is a project jointly funded by Wyndham City, the State and Federal Governments, Werribee Football Club, AFL, and AFL Victoria.

## Bigger, better community centres

Community Learning Centres across Wyndham are being transformed, making way for a larger range of Council services to be provided locally, along with additional space for community learning and outdoor areas.

### Point Cook Community Learning Centre

The early works have wrapped up, and the demolition of some of the external parts of the building have begun. Expected to be complete by the end of the financial year.

### Wyndham Vale Community Learning Centre

The fences are up, and works on the inside have kicked off. Demolition is beginning with works likely to be complete by the end of January 2018.

### Tarneit Community Learning Centre

The design process has begun, and we're engaging with users of this centre to help us deliver a centre for all to love and enjoy. Expected to be complete by 30 January, 2019.

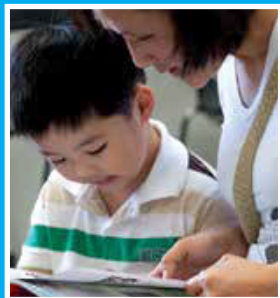
