Werribee City Centre



1.
WATER TOWER
3 Tower Road

Water, channelled from a diversion weir on the Werribee River, was pumped to the top of the tower, providing pressure for the town's supply.



2.
CROSSROADS UNITING CHURCH AND MANSE
19 Duncans Road

The former St Thomas the Apostle, now the Crossroads Uniting Church, was dedicated and opened as a Presbyterian Church on 28 September 1884.



3.
SHIRWAL COURT
35 Deutgam Street

Shirwal Court, now known as Villa Franca, was built in 1938 for prominent local poultry farmer Walter Carter.



4.
FIRST SHIRE OF WYNDHAM OFFICE
223 Watton Street

Council occupied these offices until 1894 when a new, larger office was established (see item 8) to better meet the needs of the growing population.



5.
BUNGEY'S HOLE
Chirnside Park

Bungey's Hole was the original water supply for Werribee, with water carted in barrels by horse and cart.



6.
ST ANDREW'S ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH
105 Greaves Street North

The original bluestone church was built in 1871, with the larger redbrick building added in 1898.



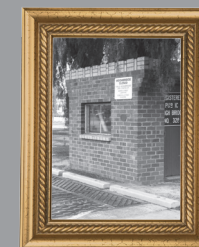
7.
WERRIBEE RAILWAY STATION
Comben Drive

Constructed in 1857, the station building has architectural significance for its bluestone walls and gothic style window openings.



8.
FORMER SHIRE HALL
49 Watton Street

Known locally as the 'Old Shire Offices', Werribee's second Shire Hall was built in 1893 and is now home to the Werribee District Historical Society & Museum.



9.
TROUPE PARK WEIGHBRIDGE
Watton Street

The weighing of Railway goods was carried out here, as was weighing of vehicles that required registration.



10.
SOUTH BASE STONE
Access via rear of 301 Princes Highway*

The South Base Stone was the starting point for the measurement of the base line for the geodetic survey of Victoria, undertaken in 1860.

*Access may be limited.
