## **AREA LEADER UPDATE**

### 2018 Welcome Back!

Term 1 has already been and gone and referrals to the PSFO service are coming in at a steady pace!

At the end of Term 1 in 2017, we had received 29 referrals.

In 2018 at the end of Term 1, we have received a whopping 65 referrals! As a result of this, we currently have a substantial



waiting list so please be patient. Usually this is related to timing – educators completing referrals before the end of term. We will commence screening calls in Term 2 to those educators who are waiting for service so we can start discussions about priorities and things that be commenced while you are waiting for a visit.

At the start of every year we complete 'meet and greet' visits to all services in the Wyndham area. This is to provide updated information about our service and answer any questions that you may have. So far, we have completed a total of 68 visits. Our priority is referrals, so if you have not yet received a meet and greet visit, we are doing our best to get out to you. In the meantime, please email us at psfo.service@wyndham.vic.gov.au if you would like to plan ahead and make a booking.

At the start of the year we also launched the trial of the Inclusive Practices Group Referral. We have received a handful of group referrals and commenced visits. This is an emerging space for the PSFO team and the approach may be modified along the way. We are interested to hear your feedback and if you have any further suggestions for the group referral process. So far, we have had positive responses from those educators who have had visits from us in this format. This newsletter will be focusing on communicating concerns with parents and having tricky conversations. In addition to the information that is in the newsletter, we have many resources and books relating to this and an array of other topics also.

## COMMUNICATING YOUR CONCERNS TO FAMILIES

Communicating concerns to parents can be difficult at times, even for the most experienced Early Childhood Educators. The way you communicate will either encourage partnerships or get parents offside. A partnership works best when messages are clear, specific and considerate of the other persons feelings.



## Always talk to parents with the goal of strengthening relationships

#### **Approaching Parents**

Remember: positive – *need* – *positive* 

- Start by providing some positive feedback to the family
- Discuss the child's needs in a sensitive manner
- Finish on another positive

E.g.: "I have prepared some notes on Grace's participation in the program. She is doing really well at remembering and following the routine. However, I do have some concerns about her social interactions as she mostly prefers to play alone at kindergarten. I would like to share these observations with you. When can we meet?"

### **Organising the Parent meeting**

- Offer to meet up and discuss concerns at a time that suits the family
- Consider who will attend provide the opportunity for both parents / grandparent to attend and arrange an interpreter if necessary
- Be prepared have a few notes/observations prepared to refer to
- Consider appropriate setting for meeting and seating; ensure the attendants feel at ease
- Have a possible action plan ready

### During the Parent meeting - communicating with sensitivity

- Remember to let parents know at every opportunity that they know their child best. You are after their input to understand the situation better.
- State the factual information you have observed at kindergarten
- Ask questions as to how this information compares to the child when at home / in other social settings
- Relate this to child development information
- Make suggestions as to a possible action plan: E.g. goal template to complete together or referral forms ready for specialists / PSFO
