

# MATCHWORKS, METRO DRAINS AND RODNEY MAKE THEIR MARK...

Located in Synnot Street Werribee, MatchWorks is a community based, not-forprofit employment services provider. That is MatchWorks specialises in finding and skilling job seekers for businesses of all sizes and industry types, at no cost.

One aspect of MatchWork's suite of offerings is their Disability Employment Service where the business works with individuals who have a disability, injury or health condition to help them find employment.

Metro Drains is one such business which has taken advantage of the Disability Employment Service. Metro Drains operates from Truganina, specialises in drainage services, site cuts, soil and rock removal amongst others. Whilst technically not in Wyndham (just the other side of Boundary Road) many of the 50 staff including the Director are from Wyndham.

Coordinator Economic Growth, Lesley Rogan, recently met with Metro Drain's Director, Heath Peatling, to learn more about the business and Heath's experience with MatchWorks.

"Reliability, respect and attitude are what I look for in my staff and to be honest, that is what I find in the staff I have engaged through MatchWorks" says Heath. "I look for 100% commitment and don't judge people on the past but rather on what they are prepared to bring to the team".

"It was a challenge to find reliable, hardworking staff. I was just about to give up and I drove past MatchWorks in Synnot Street, thought I need to think outside the square, pulled up and went in. That was 6 years ago and since then, I have been working with MatchWorks and currently have 3 staff who have disabilities as part of my team". One such team member is Rodney who after a two-week trial was successful in securing a two day-a-week cleaning position at Metro Drains. Rodney lives in Werribee and describes Metro Drains as "a lovely place to work with great people. I really enjoy coming to work and I never take a sick day".

Another member of the Metro Drain's team, who was originally placed by MatchWorks, has also achieved great success. Arriving at work one morning Heath noticed this staff member picking up litter which had blown into the front of the site. Heath was impressed at the initiative and attitude on display as it was not necessarily part of their role to do so. Working with MatchWorks, this staff member has subsequently been trained, obtained licences and has progressed to Maintenance Manager with the business.

MatchWorks provides regular catch-ups with employees and the businesses involved to ensure great outcomes for both. Subsidised wages for the first six months of employment and funding for any specialised equipment are met by MatchWorks.

Congratulations and well done to Rodney, Metro Drains and MatchWorks on making your mark!



## Western Roads Upgrade

Works are underway to widen and upgrade some of Wyndham's busiest roads and intersections. Major Road Projects Victoria has commenced with works across Wyndham as part of the Western Roads upgrade project.

At Palmers Road, drainage and traffic barriers are being installed, as site investigations are also underway.

For the widening of Dunnings Road, an upgrade at the roundabout at Shaftsbury Boulevard has commenced, while works on the bridge foundations at Skeleton Creek have begun.

At Derrimut Road, motorists will see roadworks to build traffic lanes on the eastern end, while bridge works are continuing over Dry Creek and beginning over the Tarneit Station trainline.

Stormwater drainage installations have kicked off at Leakes Road, while soil is being dug and moved to prepare for the new Skeleton Creek Bridge and Laverton Creek Bridge.



The construction of eastbound traffic lanes is underway at Dohertys Road West, as is the installation of concrete drains at Laverton Creek.

At the Forsyth Road interchange, traffic barriers are currently being installed, and soil being removed.

At the Duncans Road interchange, roadworks have begun on the construction of entry and exit ramps.
