
Red-Flowering Gum Corymbia ficifolia

Origin Southern WA

Characteristics

Small to moderate evergreen trees. Dense rounded canopy, rough brown bark, which is typically longitudinally furrowed. Deep green, discolorous, leathery leaves with bronzy new growth. The flowers are brilliantly coloured red or pinkish or orange. The grafted cultivar 'Wildfire' has deep red flowers and 'Wild Sunset' has orange flowers.

Tolerances

High drought tolerance.

Facts and Trivia

The town of Drouin in Victoria is known as 'The Ficifolia Town' and has a 'Ficifolia festival' each year in February, when the trees are in flower.
