Description

Typical height:
7-9 metres

Typical width:
6-10 metres

Growth rate:
Slow to Moderate

Typical form:
Small to medium sized
evergreen broad-domed tree.

Origin

Dry inland areas in NSW,
Qld, Vic & SA.

Characteristics

Elegant, leathery, linear foliage.
Ascending structural branches
with pendulous smaller
branches and foliage. White,
strongly scented flowers.

Tolerances

High drought and frost
tolerance. Low tolerance to
waterlogging.

Facts and Trivia

Used as a fodder tree to feed
livestock, especially sheep.

Flower emits an unpleasant odour
to attract insects including flies,
butterflies and ladybeetles.
