## **Executive Summary**

The Wyndham Learning Festival took place between 23-30 November 2020 and offered more than 150 free online classes, talks and workshops from over 78 different providers. The festival was led by Wyndham Community and Education Centre with support from Wyndham City Council and was sponsored by Victoria University (VU) Polytechnic. This year's theme was 'Healthy Learning, Healthy Lives,' with activities relating to this theme and more offered for all interests and ages, including Chinese lantern making, Brazilian drumming, karate classes for beginners, dance grooves from West Africa, lessons of global cooking skills, Ancient Egyptian Hieroglyphs, and stories of resilience, peace and conflict resolution shared by the Matsunaga Institute in Hawaii. The Festival sought to reinforce the message that any learning is healthy for the mind and body, and to encourage the community to try new things, regardless of age.

Moving from running the festival as a live event as previously planned from 1-8 September 2020, to-a fully virtual experience running from 23-30 November 2020, meant that the team had to be proactive in maintaining partnerships and engagement, innovative in their thinking around the festival delivery and open-hearted to challenges facing everyone involved including event providers, sponsors, community partners and other working group members. The 2020 Wyndham Learning Festival presented a unique opportunity to respond to the isolation and despair felt by many due to the COVID-19 crisis.

As the festival went virtual this year in response to the pandemic, the working group took the opportunity to bring the world to Wyndham and Wyndham to the world and attendees and events came in from across the globe. This spotlight on Wyndham has created some dynamic and fortuitous new partnerships and networks to enhance and profile the work and leadership of Wyndham as a Learning City.

The Festival sought to deepen engagement with quality and responsible programming during the COVID-19 environment, while continuing to nurture its growing and popular reach within Wyndham and beyond. A high profile and optimistic outcome were at the heart of our vision fostering local and international collaboration. The signature event featuring Clare Bowditch, provided an optimistic yet realistic take on life and how our inner voices shape our experiences. A new series of forums deepened the festival's engagement with current debates in healthy learning, healthy lives including recovery post-COVID-19.

On behalf of the Learning Festival working group and our 2020 Sponsor Victoria University (VU) Polytechnic, we thank you for sharing this journey with us. We are both delighted and inspired by the many people who support, attend and engage with the Festival. We will be back again in 2021!

# WLF Most Significant Change Story The Open Arms of The Kulin Nation – Tuti's Story

Tuti learned about the WLF event 'PD: Introduction to the Kulin Nations' from a post that one of her classmates and also a member of the WLF working group posted on social media. Tuti has always been fascinated by the history of the Aboriginal Australians and was keen to understand their way of life before and after settlers arrived in Australia. Also, as an environmental student and professional, Tuti was particularly keen to attend the event to gain insights on how Aboriginal people preserved and interacted with their natural environment. She also hoped that this session would help her understand the challenges and the conflict the Aboriginal people face.

Tuti felt she not only gained more understanding about the history of the Aboriginal people, but she was also able to learn about how land and water (and the environment in general) was at the heart of the Aboriginal community and that a key part of their culture is focused on conservation and living in harmony with nature. Tuti had recently completed an environmental unit and the insights from this WLF session enabled her to link theory to the lived experiences of The First Nations People. Tuti felt that the facilitators were passionate about their identity and were so articulate in explaining the different language groups, important dates, and sacred sites through oral histories. The information gained in this session helped a great deal in filling the information gap that Tuti had about Aboriginal People in Australia.

The most significant insight gained from this session by Tuti was that indigenous knowledge is key in protecting and preserving the environment, and that environmental practitioners and activists have so much to learn on this topic from the Aboriginal Australians as they lived in a thriving environment long before the settlers came in, and have continued to show their resilience in protecting their environment from bush fires and helping the flora and fauna thrive.

From the session, Tuti realised that the Aboriginal community are open, welcoming, approachable, and are happy to share their cultures and knowledge with other people. According to Tuti, the picture she had of the Aboriginal People before the session was that they were a vulnerable and often closed community and not everyone could interact with them. She says hearing mention of the First Australians (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people) through Acknowledgement to Country on almost all platforms for events and meetings before the WLF had played a big role in reinforcing this false notion.

Professionally, Tuti confirmed that the most significant impact of this WLF session was that the indigenous knowledge and wisdom has the potential of addressing issues of climate change through environmental preservation. As a development practitioner, Tuti now more than ever believes in the power of local knowledge and the fact that solutions to local issues are largely held with the local Aboriginal communities.

## **Project Objective**

The Wyndham Learning Festival offers a whole-of-community eight-day annual event that provides diverse opportunities for free learning activities across the City of Wyndham.

## **Project Collaborations – The Co-Lead Team**

The Wyndham Learning Festival is led by Wyndham Community and Education Centre supported by Wyndham City Council.

## 2020 Brand Marketing

In 2020, the WCC Communications Department designed a new logo for WLF. The logo incorporates a ladder to characterise that we can always rise upwards in our learning, a cog to represent the different elements in learning and finally books and speech and thought bubbles to show how we can learn from others in different ways.



Additionally, 1000 WLF bags were printed with the WLF logo on one side, and the artworks of two local artists shared on half of the bags each. All 1000 bags were distributed across the community, through the libraries 'Library to You' delivery and pick up service, to some local kindergartens and to food programs operating through community centres due to the pandemic. Ten bags were given to each of the winning artists to share with their own communities and networks.





Due to the complications surrounding distributing printed program guides during the restrictions and risk of contamination from physically handing out programs, a simple PDF program guide was developed and hosted on the website, and an interactive calendar hosted on the WLF website widget was offered to the community to showcase events.

Before the date change and the festival being brought to the virtual stage, 500 flyers were printed for distribution across the community.

## **Media Coverage**

A lot of the media coverage for the WLF was driven through social media and the paid work with Star Weekly and Mama Knows West. The partnership with the WCC Communications Department and the WLF Working Group, particularly for the Signature Event, supported positive media attention in the lead up to and during the festival.

## **WLF Sponsor**



A detailed prospectus was developed early in the year (pre-COVID lockdown) and distributed to potential and past sponsors of the WLF. Victoria University (VU) Polytechnic was a proud gold sponsor of the 2020 Wyndham Learning Festival. VU Polytechnic is Victoria University's vocational education provider. After the festival was brought online, it was decided to stay with just the confirmed sponsor VU Polytechnic and close the sponsorship opportunities beyond this until 2021. On Friday 25 September, a special EDM was sent to over 200 learning community partners and stakeholders showcasing VU Polytechnic as the sponsor. A dedicated Facebook post was also created celebrating their support.

VU Polytechnic offer accredited courses, apprenticeships, traineeships, non-accredited short courses and customised training programs that link closely with industry needs, skills and jobs. The annual WLF provides multiple opportunities to showcase the diversity of VU Polytechnic's education programs and excite the Wyndham community about the transformational benefits of education for work, life and self. ## **Community Engagement**

The community was engaged in various ways to encourage community involvement in both hosting WLF events and participating in scheduled events during the festival. This included running four targeted information sessions in the lead up to the festival. The first two sessions were run in March 2020 in person at the Wyndham Community and Education Centre and the Wyndham City Council Hopper's Crossing Library. The second two sessions occurred online after it had been decided to move the festival dates and move the festival online. The purpose of these sessions was to provide support

and information targeted at first-time event holders. An information kit was also developed and is available on the website <u>here</u>.

A Virtual Art Competition was run in the lead up to the festival, with seven submissions from across the community. Two local artists were selected as co-winners, chosen through blind voting by the WLF Working Group. These artworks were then screen-printed onto the WLF showbags and distributed across the community, including to library patrons as they collected reserved items. Feedback on the bags was positive, as it was seen as a 'feel-good' marketing project that also empowered local artists. It also noted that it was great to have schools involved in this project.

Additionally, members of the co-lead group attended various community meetings to share word of the festival, including the Wyndham Teachers Environmental Network and the Wyndham Humanitarian Network.

Across the year in the lead up to the festival, fifteen targeted Electronic Direct Mails (eDMs) were produced and distributed through Mailchimp to over 200 community stakeholders and partners, encouraging groups to get involved through sponsorship, joining the virtual art competition, running events and participating in the events. Communication also occurred to allow the community to know that the festival was moved online and to a later date due to COVID-19.

## **Events Offered and Demographics**

#### **WLF Attendee Feedback**

"I went to a VU Writers session on Friday night. There weren't many of us which turned out well because it meant we could chat at the end of the session".

In total, over 150 events were on offer across the eight days of the festival. This included over 115 live events, and over 26 pre-recorded events. The key signature event was an event with singer and author Clare Bowditch on Sunday 29 November 2020.

Seventy-eight different groups and individuals registered to run the various events, ranging from local government, community, education and learning groups and networks, universities, business and independent people wishing to share their knowledge and talent. Event providers came from Wyndham locally, as well as from Australia-wide networks such as the Australian Learning Communities Network, and globally from places as far as Manchester, UK, Taiwan, Turkey and Hawaii in the USA. While the WLF Working group did not capture participant data on attendees except if they were directly coordinating an event, anecdotal information as well as some surveys of events run by the co-hosts highlighted that WLF participants were primarily from Wyndham. 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## Significant Change Stories Kerry's Story – Sharing the Journey for Learning and Healing

This year Kerry attended Wyndham Learning Festival's Signature WYNTalk Event with Clare Bowditch. As she lives in Central Victoria, she found the fact that it was offered as an online event made it much more accessible. She attended because she was familiar with Clare's music and aware that she had written a book and was intrigued to learn more about her life. She saw the event advertised on Facebook and registered. The special learning which unfolded for her by participating was listening to Clare talk about her life journey. From experiencing childhood trauma to only just surviving in her twenties, to thriving in her forties, Clare's story reassured Kerry as she has been on a remarkably similar journey. It interested her that the book that helped Clare the most and that she spoke about in her session was the book Kerry had also read in her twenties. It surprised her that Kerry already uses a lot of the self-talk strategies Clare used and suggested. Clare talked about some new strategies, which Kerry had now added in her day-to-day life and which have been really helpful. The most significant impact of the festival on Kerry personally and professionally was listening to Clare reaffirming that self-talk strategies can strengthen emotional intelligence, resulting in empowerment and personal growth. Kerry just loved listening to Clare share her journey towards becoming a strong, confident and fulfilled woman.

## **Evaluation Framework**

As a benchmarking exercise before the festival was executed, members co-leading the festival from Wyndham CEC and WCC Community Learning were each interviewed before the festival and asked what success would look like to them, despite the challenges of 2020.

To the question 'what would a successful WLF look like after the festival is complete', responses included:

- Well-managed issues (managing risk i.e. Working With Children Checks)
- Good participation in events
- At least 50 online events registered
- Happy and engaged WLF partners
- WLF Toolkit was used
- Expectations were managed well
- The WLF went forward despite COVID-19.
- The world was brought to Wyndham and Wyndham to the World, with a broader offering of events of a global nature and attendees from beyond Wyndham.

These responses and objectives formed the basis of how the co-lead team measured success using the post event holder survey, in capturing Most Significant Change Stories and from the rich discussions in the reflections session.

### **Most Significant Change Technique – Qualitative Data Collection**

After the festival, Hellen Kibowen, our student placement officer, used the Most Significant Change (MSC) Technique to interview people involved in different ways in the 2020 WLF, and to capture their stories. MSC is a participatory approach to monitoring and evaluating change in projects and programs such as the WLF¹. It is participatory in nature because those who have been involved in the project can tell their story in their own words, and because they are involved in the analysis and sense-making process. Hellen led the process, and then she led a blind voting process to select the Most Significant Change story, as linked to the goals of the festival. This story with the most votes is featured at the beginning of this report below the executive summary to showcase, through narrative, how the goals of the WLF were powerfully met. The other stories have been woven throughout this document, as well as in the appendix. This final set of stories represents the collective view about the most important changes that have taken place because of the WLF, through the eyes of key stakeholders and participants. The process of storytelling and selection was used by the WLF Working group to successfully and innovatively capture what people most valued about the WLF.

### **Significant Change Stories**

Life Is A Learning Journey; We Are Never Too Young or Too Old To Learn - Hellen's Story

Hellen is on a learning journey that started with the Global Learning Festival (GLF), and then the Wyndham Learning Festival (WLF) where she has been on student placement for her Master's Degree in International and Community Development at RMIT University. In this journey, she is learning that one is never too young or too old to learn, and when people from different age groups,

demographics and backgrounds come together, intergenerational learning and magic happen. She has also come to understand that support from the local government, learning institutions and libraries are key components of lifelong learning, and so is the willingness of the community to participate in these learning opportunities. There are several impacts of the WLF on Hellen personally and professionally. Personally, Hellen has learnt to find balance in this unbalanced world, and that she can choose to live her life and achieve her goals and whatever she set's her mind to achieve. This was learned from one of the sessions on personal development, and from the 'can-do' spirit and determination of some of the hosts who went against all odds and hosted several sessions both at the GLF and at the WLF.

The other lesson she learnt was around the importance of oral histories in transmitting culture, knowledge, and important aspects of a community, and that these oral histories are taught from the moment babies are born and is a lifelong process. These oral histories play a key role in teaching the members of the society how to relate with each other and how to relate and preserve the environment and animals. These stories also act as a library of information and clarify misconception and stereotypes. For example, it is now proved through research that the First Nations Peoples of Australia had a superior diet prior to the arrival of the settlers, and it is now confirmed through research that they not only lived innately in-tune with nature, but the grass seeds that was used to make bread have more proteins than other seeds and grains in the world. Through the WLF, Hellen has also learned that serious issues affecting the world and its population can also be addressed in a very informal way, and all it takes is creating awareness of the issue and eliciting commitment to action by the members of the community.

Professionally, the most significant impact this festival has had on Hellen is that it has made her aware of the various communication styles (turn taking, pausing, and overlapping styles) and the importance of debriefing. A lot of important learning happens during the debriefing sessions.

Also, she has learnt that the community often know what is best for themselves, and as a development practitioner, her role is to tap into the local knowledge for solutions to the issues that the community face.

### WLF Feedback

### **WLF Attendee Feedback**

I wanted to write and express my gratitude for the YouTube read-along of 'Tomorrow, When The War Began' (by John Marsden). I am located in Canada, and I am currently using this novel with my English Language Arts 9 class. This past Monday we transitioned back to online learning as our state's COVID numbers are currently quite alarming. I have some struggling and reluctant readers in my class, and we are using your library's YouTube audio of this novel. Truly, it is a life-saver for me and for my students. Thank-you so much for posting these chapter read-alongs!



## **Post Festival Survey for Event Providers**

A post festival survey was sent to event providers to collect their feedback on running an event. A detailed breakdown of this is available in appendix 1. Overall, 20 event providers filled out the survey and 13 completed it fully. Generally feedback from event providers was positive, with all respondents indicating that they were likely to recommend hosting an event in the Festival to a friend or colleague. In addition, no respondent gave a poor rating to the Festival as a whole, with respondents indicating the Festival was 'good' (n = 1), 'very good' (n = 6) and 'excellent' (n = 4).

However, the survey did highlight some areas for further work, for example there were strong indications that several event providers felt confused about having to market their own events and wondered about the value if they must do it themselves. Over 50% were approached directly by one of the project co-leads to run an event. While most of the participants in events came from Wyndham and Melbourne, there was also international and national representation across many events. Over 76% said that overall they would rate the support of the organization of their event by the Festival Organizers as very high or high. Over 92% promoted their event through social media.

In terms of event providers surveyed indicating why or why not they felt their event was successful, there was a strong feel that due to COVID-19, there was a fair amount of Zoom fatigue causing lower than expected numbers compared to running a live event. Respondents said the festival had impacted on them personally by helping develop their confidence and empowerment, taught them new skills such as public speaking and they also valued the networking that occurred with both the speakers and other participants.

### **Post WLF Reflections Session**

A post WLF Reflections Session was run in early December 2020 to offer WLF Working Group members the chance to share their insights, challenges and suggestions about the 2020 festival. Feedback included:

- **Signature event:** While there were over 180 registered, there were just 54 in the audience on the day with many others requesting a copy of the recording to listen to Clare present later when they had free time. A great deal of positive feedback was received from the people who attended, including that Clare is a warm welcoming person, and offered an interactive and engaged event. Thanks to Clare's generosity with her time, the signature event went over time, giving audience members a chance to have their questions answered. The MC for the event, from the Wyndham CEC, did a great job, setting the scene for an intimate, welcoming and inclusive event. It was agreed that holding a WYNtalk as a signature event during future festivals should continue as it brings broader attention to the festival and the WynTalk branding.
- **Event Providers:** it was suggested to include the event provider toolkit on the website in a more prominent place, so event providers see and use it. A further suggestion was to request

event providers to read it before submitting their event registration form. Event providers may have been bombarded with information and thus may not have read it. Some event providers queried their involvement in the Festival, asking what was in it for them and how it added to business growth. Other providers were unaware that they would be responsible for their own communication marketing and promotion. Event providers would have liked to engage a broader audience through participation in the Festival. Clear messaging should continue - that the Wyndham CEC and WCC are providing a platform, and the role of the group and providers is to run their own activities and do their own promotion and marketing. A further message to event providers is to avoid packing too much into individual event agendas, and not to provide too many events over the week. Adult Learning Australia's 60th birthday was on at the same time, yet there was an oversight and the working group did not collaborate with them this year. The working group can provide support and advice regarding marketing if consulted with enough notice (e.g. distributing information and flyers to working group networks; doing FB posts; highlighting curated groupings of events to market segments - e.g. youth, older people, families etc.). It was suggested to keep the registration process as it is, as it worked well for most events and was seamless. It is important to ensure event providers receive early confirmation that their event has been accepted. The festival needs to be curated to ensure an appropriate diversity of events.

- **Website:** Possibly due to the addition of the program calendar, the website was slow and clunky to use this year. In addition, there were some technical issues on the Facebook page and thus issues on online marketing of events.
- **Online program:** in 2020, the Online program was much more accessible than the calendar on the website. In the future, it is necessary to ensure the online program remains a readable and accessible online booklet.
- Other Feedback: Some members of the WLF Working group did not attend any events. Others noted that there were some challenges in engaging specific cultural groups in the digital environment due to lack of technical understanding of hosting an event online. It was a struggle to get all the community centers working in a coordinated way in 2020, and a lot seemed fragmented due to the impacts of COVID-19 lockdowns. It was suggested that more work needs to occur internally to Council to bring people together and to collaborate better. A combination of the improved Melbourne weather and virtual fatigue meant that numbers were down for some events. It was suggested to start marketing the festival from the start of the year to potential event holders. Encourage people to not 'over' register to run events to decrease burnout. To allow for a more curated festival, limit the number of events to 55, with 5 being pre-recorded and the rest live. Limit the festival to run for five days to prevent burnout by the organisers. Some events did not take place as scheduled and the timing of some of the events was a barrier as some important WLF events took place when people were at work/school. Some feedback from the community was that they would like to see some of the events from 4 pm. In particular they mentioned the events on job hunting and resume

creation. Some event hosts mentioned that their participants found it hard to register for the events (the page with events took too long to load). In 2021, it is suggested to request a formal commitment from working group members taking into account their capacity and defining roles to ensure members don't burnout or risk disengagement from the project.

## **WLF 2021 Next Steps**

As we reflect on the 2020 festival, the following decisions have been agreed for 2021:

- Logistics festival to run for five days from 1-5 September 2021. The festival will be curated, with 50 live events and 5 pre-recorded events. Individuals can run one event, organisations can run two, and sponsors can run three. On the registration form, potential providers must agree they have already read the event toolkit, before submitting their event.
- Support working group to share responsibility to run regular information sessions for potential/new event providers leading up to the Festival (initially on forming ideas, logistics; and later around marketing ideas). Request a formal commitment from working group members taking into account their capacity and defining roles.
- ➤ Engagement Emphasize in the messaging that event providers are responsible for their own promotion and marketing.
- Update the website to improve visibility of particular information and to make it user-friendly
- Marketing begin from early 2021. The logo is already developed so it will just be a matter of updating the details and planning/operationalising an awareness-raising campaign.
- ➤ Reach Mailchimp eDM's do reach people in our current network. Explore ways of expanding network/mailing list. Invite global partners to attend events to bring Wyndham to the world.
- ➤ Value no printed program for 2021. Create festival bags again (include website URL) and explore ways of distributing the bags more broadly. Hold a WYNTalk as a signature WLF event.





Q5 How did you first hear about the WLF?




# Q10 Overall, how would you rate the support of the organization of your event by the Festival Organizers?



## Q11 How did you promote your event?




## Q14 Do you think that your event has had any of the below perceived impacts on participants? (mark all answers that apply)




Q15 Part 3: How satisfied you were with the broader organization of the Wyndham Learning Festival?




Q17 Would you be open to participating in the 2021 Wyndham Learning Festival?

## **Appendix 2: Various Significant Change Stories from the 2020 WLF**

### Finding Balance in an Unbalanced World - Belinda's Story

Belinda designed and ran the session 'Finding Balance in an Unbalanced World: the Oola Principle'. Belinda advertised her event on Facebook and other social media platforms and felt that having the event listed on the WLF website also helped with the marketing. The session had seven participants, which was a smaller number compared to the number of people that had registered. The event had no technical issues. Belinda hosted this event because she loves teaching and helping others have a balanced life, she started this journey by helping her family and friends with their life and business goals. She is an author and a life coach, and now combines her love of helping people find a more balanced life with her love of coaching people with their business ideas. Belinda also hosted this event because she not only thought that this would benefit the people in her community (Wyndham), but also would put her name out there and broaden her network. The most significant impact on the festival on Belinda was that she was able to interact with a new audience. She also felt that the session was interactive and that it had a positive impact on the audience. This is with the backdrop of the current pandemic where people's lives and goals had been thrown off balance. Belinda intends to make a follow up with the audience and keep them posted on her upcoming activities and events.

#### Lessons On Event Organization From A First Time Event Host – Sophia's Story

Sophia hosted three events during the WLF. These were a workshop on sustainable diets, a dialogue with farmers, and a climate conversation. She was the main speaker for the workshop on sustainable diets, and the moderator of the other two activities. She ran the events an independent and volunteered to host these sessions as a concerned member of the community. She indicated to the event organizers on acceptance of her three events that she would need additional support with the planning and executing of the event as this was the first time she had done anything like this.

Being new to running this sort of event, Sophia found it challenging to work through all the pre-event requirements, yet she managed to overcome the hurdles and went ahead to have three successful and well-attended events and along the way. She also taught herself how to market her events and also work with various online tools like Zoom, Facebook events, Eventbrite, and email reminders. Sophia was able to establish a partnership with the Wyndham City Council Sustainability team who followed up with her as she planned for the events and helped spread the word on her events.

Sophia gives credit to her classmates who, despite not residing in Wyndham, offered support and it was through their efforts that she was able to pull off the activities successful and on time. Moving forward, Sophia recommends that the festival organizers provide additional hands-on support to new event hosts in terms of preparation and marketing of the events.

The most significant impact of the festival on Sophia was that she experienced being scared, mentally tired and emotionally relieved (in that order) as she learnt how to implement her events. For Sophia, the best part was connecting with like-minded individuals in the community, and the affirmation that

people are open to these kinds of activities. She confirmed that she would continue to run such events in 2021.

### What It Takes To Host An Online Learning Festival -Tee's Story

Tee was heavily involved in planning for the WLF, including attending the WLF monthly working group meetings and developing the agenda, contacting my network channels to encourage them to run an event for WLF or to share event information, creating WLF social media posts and events, creating and uploading events onto the WLF website events calendar and contacting some of the event holders to get missing information to help promote their WLF event effectively.

As this was her first year being involved in the festival, she found it challenging not knowing what was involved in running the WLF. However, after attending the WLF Working Group meetings from the start of the year, she was able to gain a better understanding and identify how she could best support the team with it. Additionally, once the call for events went out, Tee found that insufficient information being provided by event holders when they initially registered because they were still planning the details of their events, made it difficult to effectively promote their events. Also, while initially the festival was planned as a live event, Tee found it challenging to have to adapt to all events to be delivered online due to the pandemic.

For Tee, the most significant impact of the WLF was the learning that unfolded as she discovered what the WLF actually was. It was also impactful to be a part of the team, gaining this experience, learning new skills and pulling off a successful event.

### Profound Partnerships At The Heart Of A Successful WLF - Jac's Story

Jac was involved in the Wyndham Learning Festival as one of the lead organisers of the project this year. She also partnered with others to run several events including the Australian Learning Communities Network Showcase, The COVID-19, Wellbeing and the Middle-School Years Webinar, and the Introduction to the Kulin Nations Professional Development session. Jac sat on the broader WLF working group across the year taking minutes and also played a key role in managing marketing and communications. This included developing bulk emails to event providers, designing and distributing EDM's through Mailchimp, managing some of the backend of the website and being an editor of the WLF Facebook page.

For Jac, the most significant impact that this project had was that when the organisers decided to bring the WLF to a virtual platform in response to the unpredictability of the pandemic and social restrictions, how positively everybody moved to ensure the WLF still occurred. She also valued how different members of the working group contributed to the events and overall project despite their own challenges during this uncertain year and how people let the co-lead team know what their capacity was and provided input based on that. While it was a lot of work, and a lot more quantity control than she realised initially to ensure that the events were of high-quality, the final result was very positive, and she felt the reputation of the WLF remains high. Being able to work at the WLF Lead Wyndham

Community and Education office once a week to be able to physically connect with the lead organisation, allowed the lead team to be frank and open hearted in their conversations in the lead up to the festival. Then when the team members were no longer able to physically be in the office due to COVID-19, they had already established a connection between the core lead working group to more authentically address any issues as they arose later in the year.

Speaking specifically about the events she was involved in coordinating, Jac loved seeing the speakers empowered as they shared their stories or research, she loved meeting (even though it was online) people who are highly regarded in their industries and the accessibility the project provided to meet these people, for example meeting Clare Bowditch who spoke at the signature event. She loved reading through the feedback from event providers and also those who attended different events to see how the event had impacted on them in unique ways, such as one provider saying to Jac: "oh I just LOVE working with people from Council - you get things DONE!"

She valued the project working group and being able to meet monthly to gain an update on how they were progressing and to review any risks and challenges.

### Small Connections for Big Impact - Meg's Story

Meg works for the Wyndham Community and Education Centre (Wyndham CEC), which was the lead agency for the festival, and led the team in coordinating the Wyndham City Learning festival in partnership with Wyndham City Council. Her key role was chairing the festival's working group meetings and ensuring the overall success of the 2020 Wyndham Learning Festival.

While there was a small amount of sponsorship funding support, the key challenge for Meg was that the festival was not staff funded. This meant that the team had to work around the limited resources available including around staff time. Meg says that the administrative support provided by Tee from Wyndham CEC was invaluable and she was also grateful for the support she received from the co-lead partners at Wyndham City Council from the Learning Community Unit.

The other challenge was that the team had to perform tasks outside their areas of specialisation to the best if their capacity and within the other existing constraints of funding and time. The team had to take up additional tasks in marketing, fundraising, website management, event management, and communication. The council's marketing and communications team did provide some help but with the magnitude of such an event, the team still needed additional Communications support especially in areas such as preparing e-newsletters, targeted marketing and advertising. Also, having team members with high level fundraising skills would be a key asset. Regarding the event hosts, there was a need to manage expectations and communicate from the onset the kind of support that the organizers are able to provide with their limited capacity.

The most significant impact of the festival on Meg is about the connection that a specific event has on people. She says it is all about the small connections that lead to something else later.



#### An Inspiring Project in a Difficult Year - Diane's story

Diane was part of the WLF working group that coordinated the Festival, and she also attended and coled several events over the eight days.

Diane attended various events because she values the commitment and energy of the working group in bringing the Festival together. Diane's involvement in some the event activities was in the form of coordinating or Emceeing, and beyond this, she attended out of interest and wishing to learn new skills and to support event providers.

Diane reported that the Clare Bowditch event really resonated with her – she felt that Clare's strategies for taming the negative self-talk were spot on, easy to understand and most importantly easy to implement. Diane was also moved by the AMES Refugee Stories event and felt very privileged to hear such moving accounts of difficult journeys by resilient people. She also found The Kulin Nation PD quite insightful and, having attended a similar event previously, she was able to add to her understanding of the inequities and injustices experienced by Aboriginal people in Australia. Diane feels that this is something that the community need to continually discuss and find ways of addressing and hopes that a similar event can be a mainstay of future Festivals.

The most significant impact of the festival for Diane was that professionally she gained a lot of skills from attending events and got to work on such an amazing and inspiring yearlong project. The WLF is the highlight of Diane's work year — as it is a chance to really feel like she is making a difference to the Wyndham community. At a personal level, Diane felt that the project was simultaneously exhausting and exhilarating — with lots to learn, and lots to do; and she considers herself lucky to have this project to work on in such a difficult year.
