

Easter Egg Card

Let's make a bright and colourful Easter card!

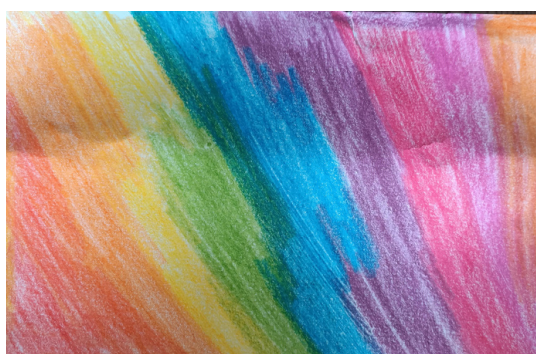
What you need:

- Paper
- Colouring supplies
- Scissors
- Glue

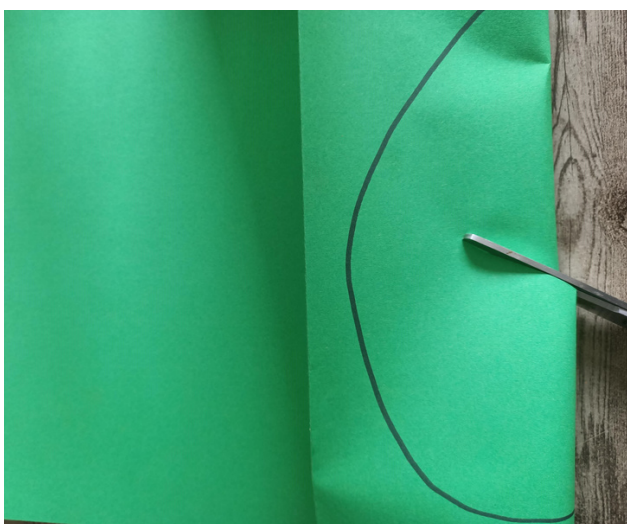
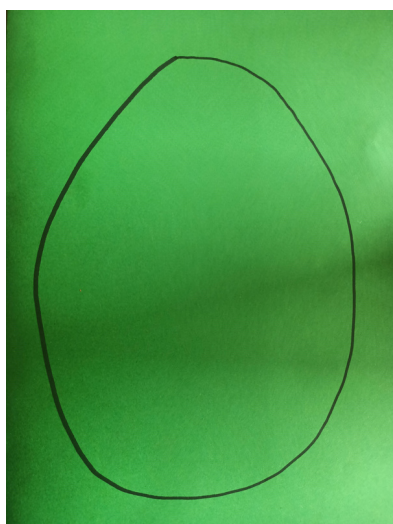


What to do:

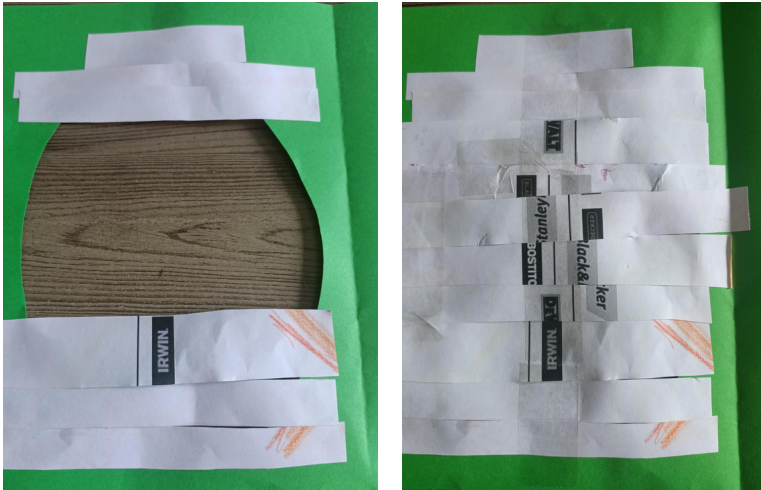
- Colour in a piece of paper (if you made the Easter Handprint Rabbit Card you can use the leftover paper from that activity if you have enough). Use lots of colours and make it bright and cheerful. You can make up a pattern to colour in.
- Now cut up the paper into strips.. Don't make them too small, about 2cm or larger is a good size.



- Fold a piece of paper in half and draw an egg shape, then cut it out. A trick to cutting out the middle bit of paper without cutting the edge is to fold the paper in half and make a small snip, then unfold and place your scissors through the hole you just snipped and then cut out the shape.



- Open the card up and start sticking the pieces of paper to the inside of the egg shape. You will want to use a little bit of glue on both ends of the strip of paper and stick it to the inside of the card one at a time until the egg shape is covered, like in the picture below (I used scrap paper for this so that is why you can see something on the other side of the paper).



- Once the egg shape is covered in paper strips, fold the card up and decorate the front. You can write an Easter message to someone inside the card too. You can also glue a piece of paper over the paper strips inside the card so it does not look messy.

- An extra activity to do here is use the scrap of paper from the egg shape you cut out and decorate that as well. You could punch a hole and tie some string through it and hang it up like a decoration. Or glue the egg to a folded piece of paper and now you have another card!
