

Salt Painting

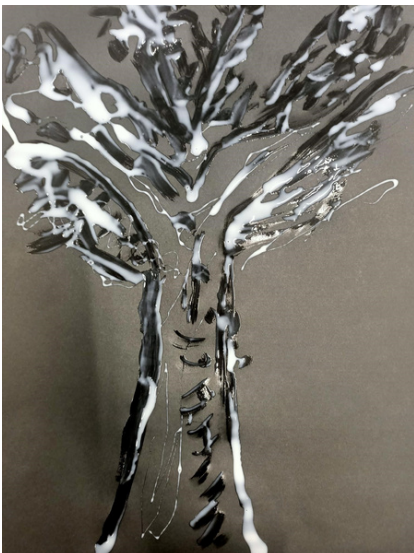


What you need:

- Paper
- Paintbrush
- PVA glue
- Salt
- Tray
- Watercolour paints (if you do not have watercolour you can mix a little bit of acrylic or poster paint with a little bit of water like I did)

What to do:

1. Prepare your area because this is a messy craft. I layered a lot of newspaper on my table.
2. Paint a picture using the PVA glue onto the paper. I used black paper so you can see the picture, but you can use any colour you like. Make the PVA glue lines thick, but try to stop it all running together.



3. If you have a tray, place the paper inside that and pour the salt over the glue. Leave it for about 10 minutes to settle then shake the excess salt off into the tray.



4. Time to get your paints ready. I mixed my acrylic paint in a cup with a little water to make it runny so it's like watercolour paint. Carefully paint over the salt without moving the salt everywhere. I loaded my brush up with paint and gently dabbed it onto the salt. Watch the paint spread onto the salt!



5. Leave your painting to dry overnight and add any finishing touches. I drew in more detail with pencil and added some extra stickers and shapes.
