Jumping, paper plate whale

What you need:

- Glue/ sticky tape
- Scissors
- Popsicle stick or skewer
- Paint
- Paint brushes
- Textas/Pencils
- Paper plate
- Different shades of blue paper

What to do:

- Draw, colour and cut out a whale on paper. Stick the popsicle stick or skewer on the back of the whale. If you do not have either of these at home, you can use a pencil or fold up a strip of paper.
- Paint the frontside of the paper plate, this will be the water.
 Once dry, cut a line across the middle of the plate, best way to do this is to gently fold the plate in half and snip the middle,. Don't cut the plate in half though!
- On your blue paper, draw waves and cut them out. Or draw and colour waves on white paper.
 Using glue, stick your waves on the painted side of the paper plate, you can add as many waves as you like. For the first wave, just glue along the edge. You will need a pocket between the wave and plate for later.
 Make sure your cut is covered when sticking the the waves on. And that the cut and waves are facing the same direction.
- Once the waves are stuck down, cut around the edge of your paper plate to remove any excess paper.
- Thread your popsicle whale through the top of your wave and out through the other side of your cut.
- Now you can make your whale jump through the waves.
