

Paper Roll Castle

What you need:

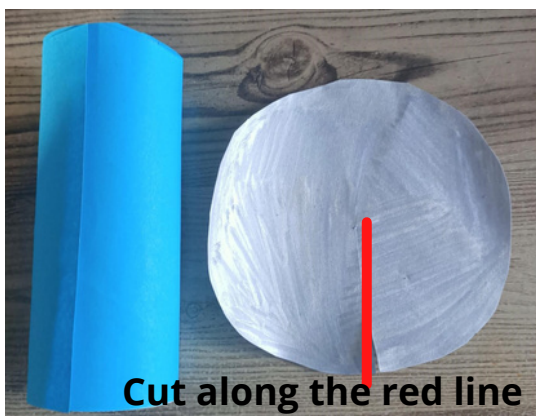
- A few paper rolls
- Paper plate
- Paper
- Skewer or something similar
- Pencils/textas
- PVA glue

What to do:

1. Cut out a circle of blue paper that will fit into the inside of the paper plate. Or you can colour it in. Mine is blue because I wanted my castle to be an ice castle on an icy moat.



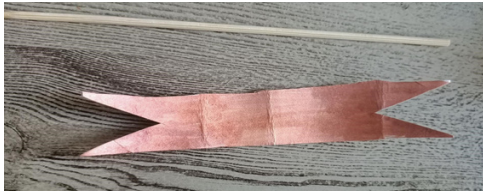
2. Cover the paper rolls in coloured paper or colour them in. To make the top of the turret, cut some squares out along the top of the paper rolls. Draw on windows and doors.



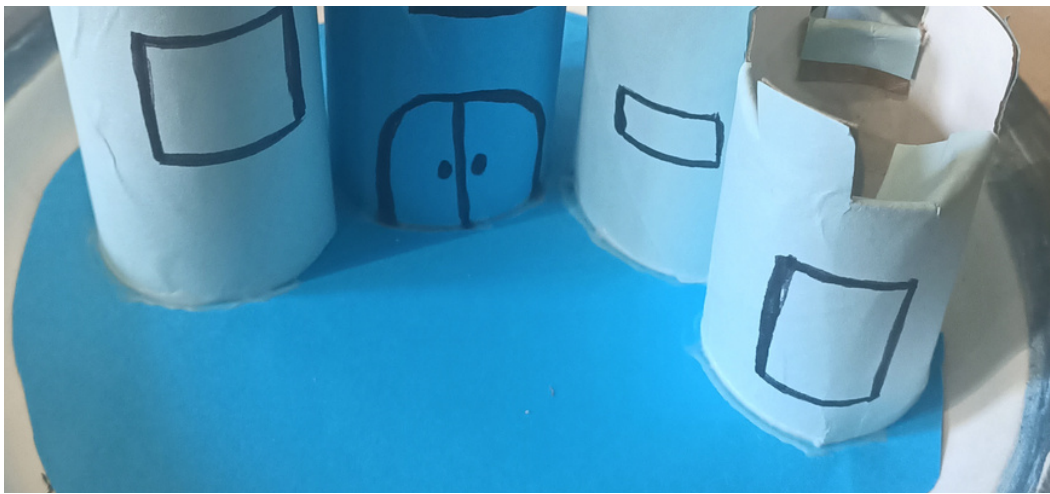
3. Cut out a circle from paper and colour it in. This will make the roof for the castle. Cut a line halfway through the circle. Then shape the paper into a cone shape and use tape or glue to stick to the top of the roll.



4. Cut out a flag shape from paper, and stick to a skewer. Cut the small tip off the roof and slide the flag through.



5. To assemble the castle, run the PVA glue along the edge of the paper rolls and then stick them down onto the plate. Leave the glue to dry for a few hours, then using a brush, brush more glue along the edge of the roll where it is sitting on the plate to make it stronger. If you have a hot glue gun at home, use it for this step.



6. When the glue is dry, you can display your castle somewhere. I use mine as a texta holder!



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
