MAKE A CAR RAMP OUT OF PAPER PLATES!

What you need:

- 4 paper plates
- Long cardboard roll, or paper to roll up
- Glue/sticky tape
- Thick piece of cardboard, like something from a box
- Pencils/textas
- Scissors

What to do:

1. If you do not have a long cardboard roll, roll up a long piece of paper (a new pieces of newspaper will do) and use sticky tape to hold it together.



2. Stand the roll on the middle of each plate and draw around it. Then draw a line from the middle to the edge, like in the picture below. Cut along this line and cut out the circle.







3. Decorate the roll and plates. I drew lines onto my plates so it looks like a road.





- 4. This next step is a bit tricky. You need to stick the plates onto the roll, curving them around in a spiral. Have a look at the pictures to help you. Thread the plates onto the roll through the hole you cut out in the middle. Stretch the plate out so that it curves around in a 'C' shape. I used a lot of sticky tape to secure the plate to the roll. Take the next plate and tape the end onto the first plate. Repeat this until all the plates are stuck together in a spiral shape around the roll.
- 4. Stick the end of the roll onto the cardboard so that it is stable when it stands up.





5. When you are happy with how everything fits together, test the ramp out! You can make the Tissue Box Car Wash activity from this week and the Tissue Box Car Park from the Cardboard week to go with your ramp!
