India 11.9% | New Zealand 3.9% | Philippines 3.2%



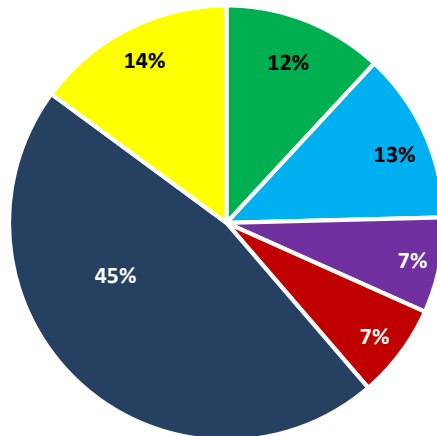
