# Capital Works Highlights....

#### It's my pleasure to present Wyndham City's Annual Report for 2021/22.

Despite the many challenges we have faced as a result of the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, Council has continued to focus on providing leadership and advocating for the needs of the community, as well as the continued delivery of our essential services that our community rely on.

Council is particularly proud of the \$124.4 million of capital works delivered, which are extremely important for our growing municipality. They provide the community with much needed infrastructure and ensure an enjoyable quality of life for residents.

Some capital works highlights include:

- Koomail Tardy Community Centre (\$7.5 million) which opened in June 2022
- Construction of Truganina South East Reserve which is adjacent to Koomail Tardy Community Centre (\$12 million)
- Construction of the Bembit Bag-rook Community Centre (\$5.7 million)
- Commenced construction of the Manor Lakes North Integrated Family Centre (interim name)
- Completed the Galvin Park Soccer Pavilion (\$4.1 million) redevelopment in Werribee
- Began construction on Bensonhurst Reserve and Brookdale Rd Reserve Point Cook
- Completed \$2.8 million worth of playgroup and park upgrades across the municipality
- Continued the implementation of the \$4 million annual Active Transport Network program which aims to connect the missing links in the municipality's walking and cycling paths.

As a growing municipality, Council is reliant on the work of the Federal and State Government to ensure the community has access to transport, local jobs and educational opportunities. Council has been active in ensuring both levels of government understand the needs of the Wyndham community, in the lead up to both the Federal and State elections. In particular, Council has:

- Prioritised advocacy for the 'Activating East Werribee' campaign. East Werribee has the potential to deliver 60,000 new jobs in Melbourne's West, by creating a new hub for employment, education, and community
- Continued the Schools4Wyndham campaign which through its momentum assisted Wyndham to successfully secure State Government funding for six new schools in the May 2022 budget – a win for Wyndham families
- Continued its commitment to advocacy for improved public transport for residents calling for improvements to the rail network and a commitment from the State government to build the much-needed additional train stations on the regional rail line.

I would like to commend my fellow Councillors and council staff for their demonstrated commitment and flexibility to our rapidly changing environment.

And, of course, I thank our community for your resilience and support for each other during these challenging times. For showing your spirit and enthusiasm for our community and getting behind Wyndham business, community clubs and organisations during 2021/22.
