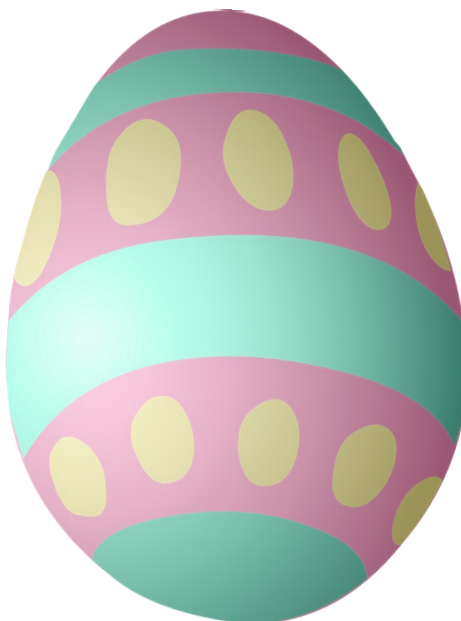
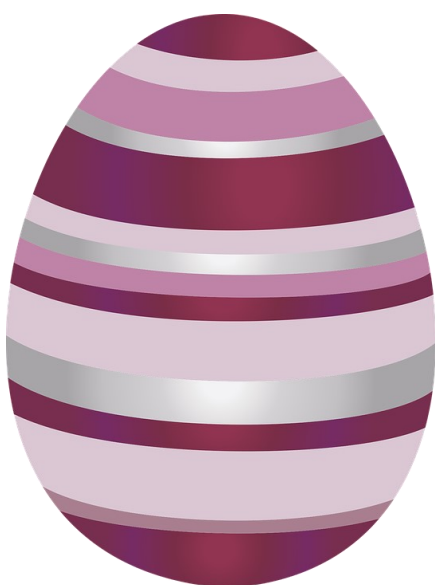


Easter Hunt

Looking for an alternative to a chocolate egg hunt?

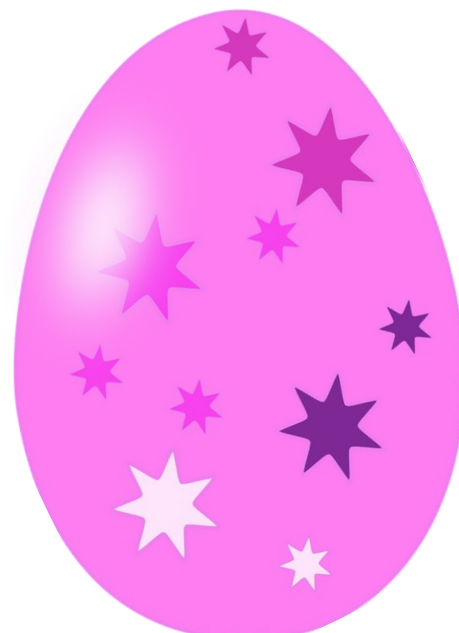
Use the images below. Print, cut them out and stick them to cardboard for stability.
