## **Project Background**

The Future Wyndham project is all about planning the future of our City. It's a chance for the community to have a say in what Wyndham should look like in 25 years' time.

The project will refresh the Wyndham 2050 Community Vision and help inform the next Council Plan (including the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan) as well as the Long-Term Financial Plan and Asset Plan.

The first deliverable from the project, the Wyndham 2050 Community Vision, sets out our community's hopes and priorities for the future. It helps guide planning—not just for today, but for the years ahead. It is developed by the community, for the community through a deliberative engagement process.

This process involves randomly selected participants who receive balanced information, discuss and evaluate key issues over several days with independent facilitators, and present well-informed recommendations to the council.

In February, 150 community members, randomly selected from our People's Advisory Panel, from across Wyndham joined the Future Wyndham Community Panel. On Saturday, 15 February, 108 panel members came together to review a summary of the thousands of ideas gathered from community surveys, workshops, and pop-up events during **stage one of this project.** They also heard insights from Council staff and members of the 2021 Panel who created the existing Community Vision. Over the day, they worked together to refresh the Wyndham 2050 Community Vision and create a range of priorities for Council to focus on to help progress the Vision. These included priorities for Wyndham as a whole, and place-based priorities for Tarneit and Truganina, Little River, Werribee South and Rural Areas, Wyndham Vale, Manor Lakes and Werribee's West, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing and Point Cook and Williams Landing.

The Draft Vision and priorities were open for community feedback from 17 February to 17 March. During this time, residents shared their thoughts to help the Panel finalise the Vision before it goes to Council. This report summarises the feedback received via The Loop during this time.





# **Summary of Feedback**

Community members were asked a range of questions about the Draft Vision and Wyndham wide and Place Based Priorities. Feedback captured under each question is represented below.

Feedback received outside of these themes were categorised as statements not relevant to the Vision or Priorities but have been included in the Community Feedback Dashboard.

The Future Wyndham Community Panel will use this feedback to finalise the Wyndham 2050 Community Vision and priorities. At the March Council Meeting, they will present the final Vision together with recommendations for key Council plans, including the Council Plan (including the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan, Long-Term Financial Plan and Asset Plan).

Council will use these recommendations to draft each Plan before they are presented for community feedback in April.
