Who Lives in and Around Tarneit?



71,542 residents in Tarneit in 2025

Median age is 30 years old

57% of Tarneit residents were born overseas
16% of those born overseas arrived in the last 5 years
64.2% of the population speak a language other than English.
This is an increase of 95.6% since 2016.

India 28.8% | New Zealand 3.6% | Phillipines 3.4%


