## GETTING THERE & PARKING

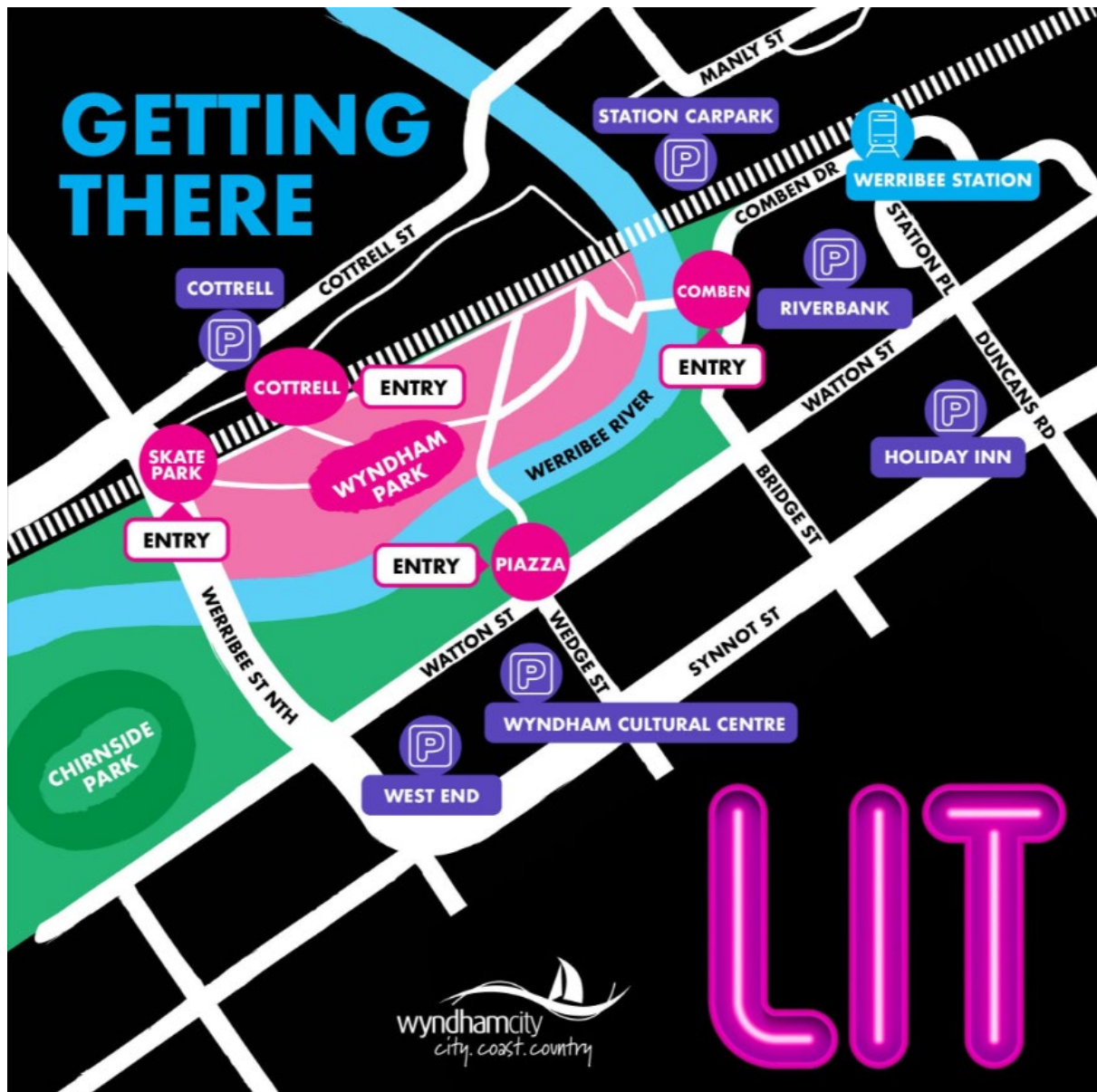
There are a range of public car parks near Wyndham Park. These include:

- Cherry Street Car Park

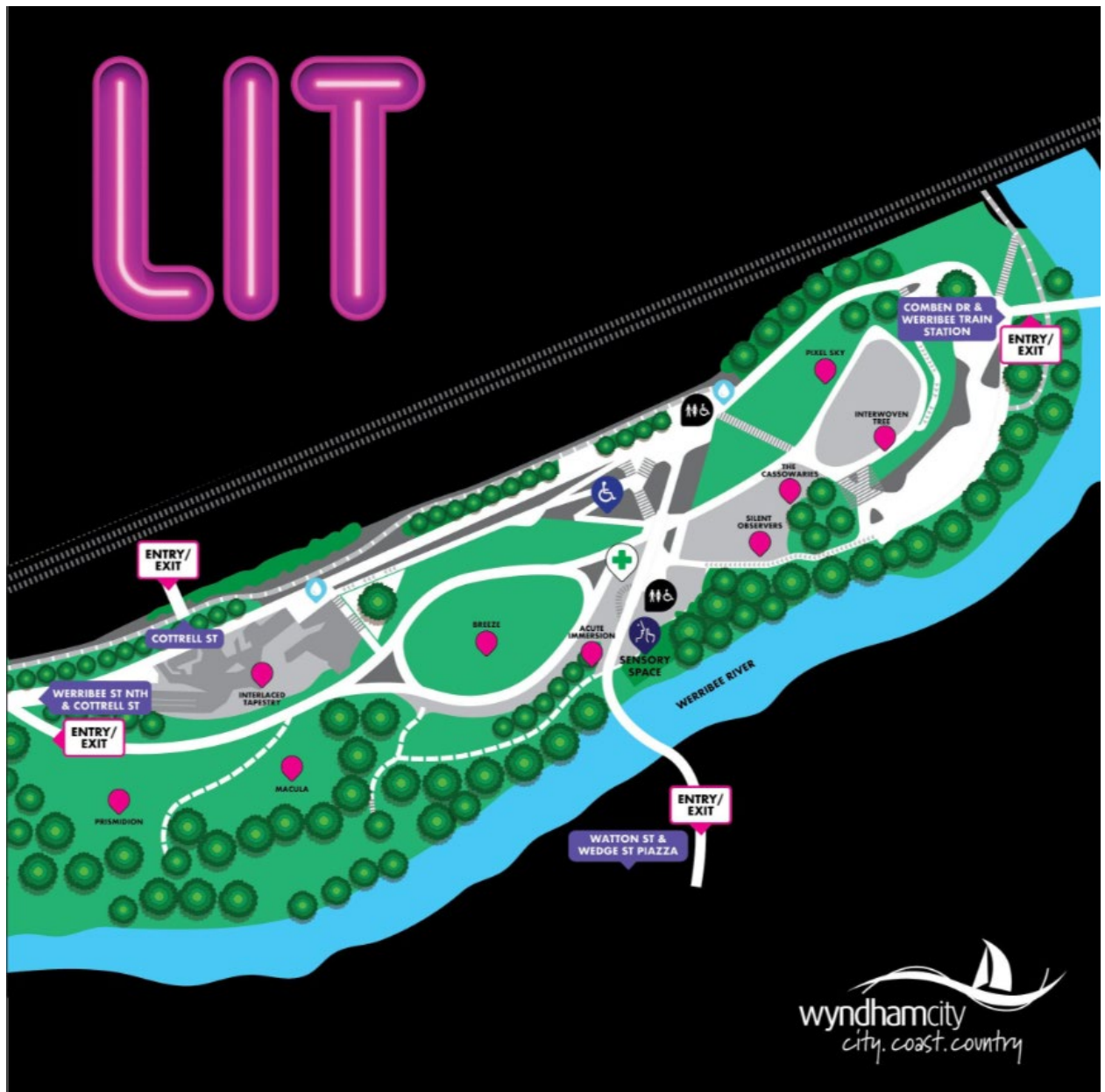
Accessible Parking is available in all car parks listed. There is also street parking available along Watton Street and Synnot Street.

Wyndham Park is approximately a 500m walk from the Werribee Train Station and the Werribee Station/Manly Street bus terminal.

## ENTRANCE

There are four pedestrian access points through which I can enter LIT at Wyndham Park.

- Wedge Street Piazza, Watton Street.
- Across Bicentennial Bridge from Comben Drive.
- Cottrell St Car Park from Cottrell Street
- Wyndham Park Skate Park – via Werribee St Nth

When I arrive, event staff will be at the entry to welcome me. Wristbands for children will be available at the entry points. Parents or carers can write their mobile number on the wristband in case they become separated during the event.



# The Artworks/ Installations at LIT

## Breeze - by Ramus

Breeze is a brand-new concept specifically crafted for LIT 2026. Located on the main lawn it includes visual artworks projected on to large drapes. It is possible to walk under and around this work. Part of this work is the representation of a storm. During this sequence there may be some loud music and sound effects and some flashing lights or lightning effects.



## Macula by HORSE

A large sculpture made of bamboo with moving geometric projections.

Macula is an immersive experience as the audience is invited to walk through this artwork. I can also choose to not walk through and simply watch.

There is an ambient soundtrack and some bright light from the projections.



## Silent Observers by HORSE

Silent Observers is an art installation made of tree discs that are brought to life through projection mapping of the tree rings. The installation has very gentle projection movements and ambient music that plays with it.

## PIXEL SKY by Studio John Fish

This work consists of over 1000 individually controlled coloured lights suspended above the audience.

The lights will flash and move in different patterns and at different speeds with a gentle audio sound track. It is possible to lie under them or walk up and down the hill while they flash overhead.



## The Cassowaries by A Blanck Canvas

The Cassowaries are a pair of 4.5 metre tall, illuminated sculptures which glow brightly.

They don't move but the colours change and there is an audio track.

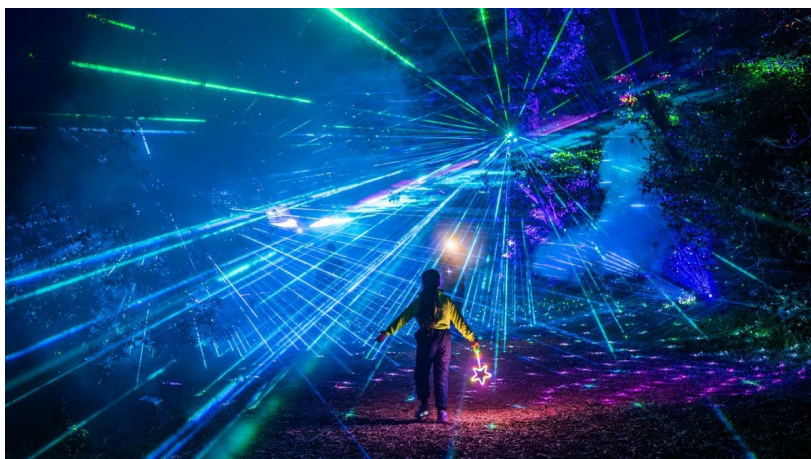


## Acute Immersion by Genius Laser

Is an 85-metre long illuminated laser trail. Enhanced by a soft haze that creates a sense of walking through the light, it takes around five minutes to walk through.

There will be flashing lights and bright colourful lasers and an audio soundtrack along the trail. The lasers will be bright but are safe and will not hurt my eyes. The haze is also safe to breathe but may have a strange smell.

If there are concerns that this trail walk might be disorienting, viewing this artwork is optional.



## PRISMIDION by Chalk River Labs

Inspired by the Pyramids of Giza, PRISMIDION is a pyramid shaped sculpture that uses projectors to show different interpretations of sacred geometry. The work shows swirling projected patterns in bright colours and there is an ambient rhythmic soundtrack that plays along with the sculpture.



## Interwoven Tree by Rebecca Kable

Local Wyndham artist Rebecca Kable has designed a series of light-based artworks as part of the GOBO walk for LIT 2026.

These hand drawn artworks will be projected onto the foot path. People can walk along and through the light to view the pictures.



## Interlaced Tapestry by Chalk River Labs

Is a large moving digital artwork inspired by yarn bombing that will project onto the slide and playground equipment. The images will move and change and the area will have a gentle audio soundtrack.

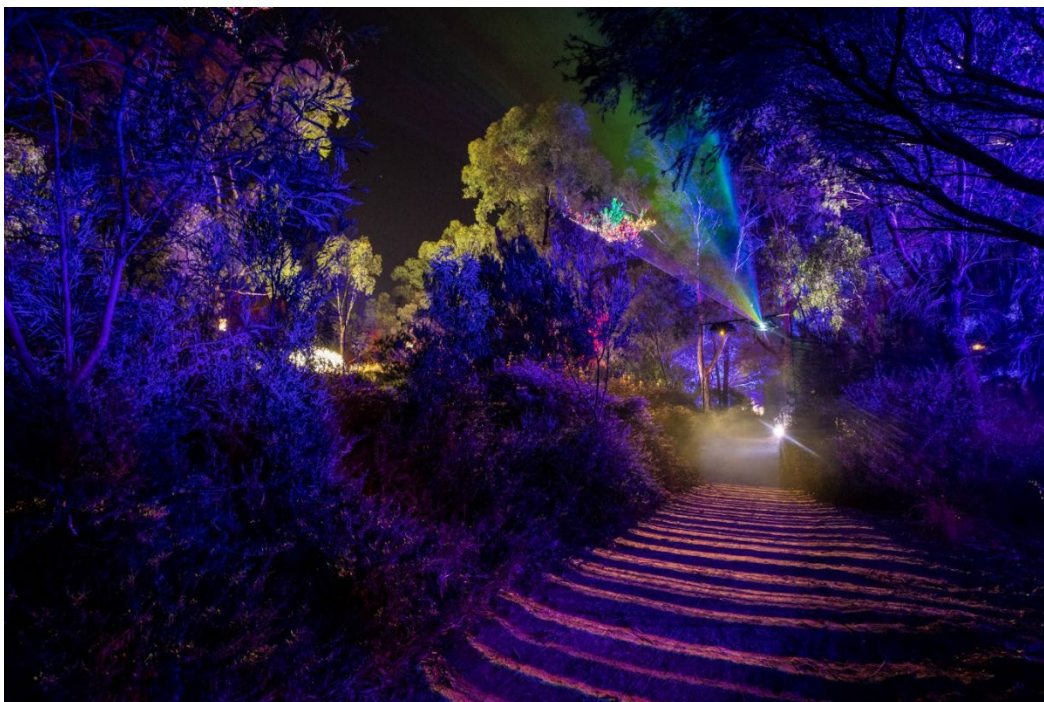


## General Park Feature Lighting

The park will feature additional lighting, including illuminated pathways, trees, a unique bridge lighting feature, entrances, and safety lighting.

The event may also include moving, flashing and strobing lighting effects and smoke or haze.

Please note that the space is not sound-proof and residual sound from the event can be heard outside of the different areas of the park.



## SENSORY SPACE

There is a sensory space I can go to if I need a quieter space to self-regulate and assist with reducing sensory input.

It can be found behind the orange bridge in the centre of the park, near the entrance to the **Acute Immersion** Trail, and near the First Aid tent.

## HIDDEN DISABILITIES

The event supports the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Initiative. Prior to the event I can pick up one free Sunflower product from any Wyndham City Council Library. If I need assistance on the day, I can ask a staff member wearing a pink high-vis vest or look for a staff member wearing this badge or lanyard.



# TOILETS

There will be toilets including an accessible toilet located on the top and bottom levels of Wyndham Park. Access to the top level toilets block is via stairs or the accessible ramp.

Please note, there are no toilets with a hoist or shower facilities onsite.



## PEOPLE & SENSORY FRIENDLY NIGHT

The event attracts large crowds and can be very busy at the entrances and along the pathways or around the installations.

For a quieter experience, it is best to visit on weekdays or during the Sensory Friendly Night on Monday 27 April 2026.

On this night, the lighting and sound will be adjusted to make the environment more comfortable. The quietest way to enter LIT is through the Skate Park entrance.



## **FOOD**

There are no food or drinks available for purchase onsite at LIT.

LIT is in the centre of Werribee, with easy access to local restaurants and cafes. You are welcome to bring your own food or takeaway into the event.

LIT is an alcohol-free event, and bringing your own alcohol is not permitted.

## **WATER**

I can bring my own water bottle and fill it up at the water fountains located in multiple locations in the park.

# STAFF

If I need help, I can find event staff to help me. They will be wearing pink high-vis vest with EVENT STAFF displayed on the back of it.
