Who Lives in and Around Tarneit?



71,542 residents in Tarneit in 2025

Median age is **30** years old

41% families with children

10% of residents are lone person households



57% of Tarneit residents were born overseas

16% of those born overseas arrived in the last 5 years

64.2% of the population speak a language other than English.

This is an increase of **95.6%** since 2016.

India **28.8%** | New Zealand **3.6%** | Phillipines **3.4%**

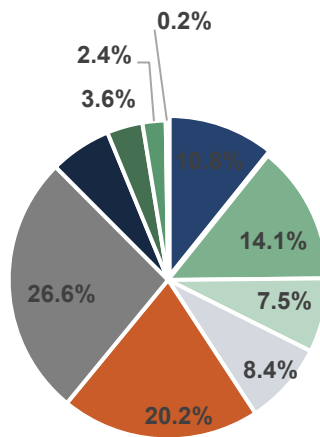


25,815 people living in Tarneit in 2021 were employed, of which **60%** worked full-time and **33%** part-time
