India 28.8% | New Zealand 3.6% | Philippines 3.4%



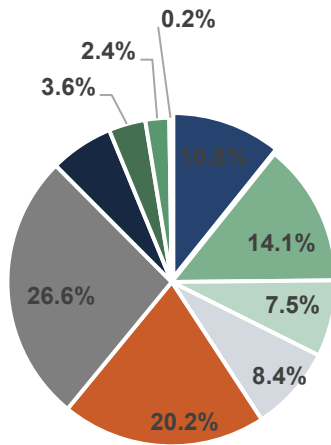
